Dear Bayview Families,

Welcome back to term 2! It is going to be a full on term with water safety lessons for our Year 1-4 students and our long awaited camp for our year 5-6 students.

We also have some fundraising activities happening this term. The big one being a raffle. First prize is a trip! Two return tickets to Queenstown, 2 nights accommodation in a 4 star hotel including breakfast and 2 day car hire! Other prizes include: Canon super zoom powershot SX540 HS camera; Cricket NZ gear; Glenfield Mall voucher: and Gull NZ merchandise. Tickets will be sent home to all families to sell on 19th May.

LOCKDOWN

On Wednesday 3rd May we had to go in to lockdown at Bayview School at 2.45pm. I am very proud of the way our staff and students reacted during this very stressful time. I am also very impressed with the NZ Police and the way they liaised with us both during and after the incident. During the incident a liaison officer stayed in the office communicating what was happening with me. After the incident the officer in charge of the operation came and saw me and complimented us on how well we reacted and stayed calm following our procedures. On Thursday morning our education liaison officer called in before school to speak with parents and students to answer any questions and to praise us again for the way we handled the situation.

The incident involved a man robbing the Glenfield ANZ bank and then making his way through Bayview to escape capture from the police. The police were unsure at the time if he was armed but as a precaution asked us to go into lockdown. The man made his way down through Lynn Reserve, through the path bordering the stream and then up into Glendhu Rd. The whole time he was tracked by the police helicopter and police dogs. The police asked us to keep the children in so that the children did not disturb the scent the dogs were following and it allowed the police to track without any concerns for the children's safety.

In a lockdown at school a message is put over the speaker system and then 3 short bells are rung and then 3 long bells. This tells teachers to bring their children down onto the mat quietly, teachers lock all external doors and windows, close curtains and then proceed to keep the children calm. A lockdown lasts for as long as the police decide. It is designed to keep the staff and students safe in a potentially dangerous situation.

Notes for parents during a lockdown:

- No child will be permitted to leave their class until the lockdown has been lifted, even if their parent is there.
- If an offender is in the school grounds, doors will not be opened to allow parents into classes. Our priority is the children.
- Children will not be able to move to their sibling's class.
- It is up to the adults to take themselves to a safe space. Last Wednesday the offender may have been armed and the parents who stood outside watching the drama unfold didn't realise just how close the offender was to them. I would suggest that parents go to our staffroom, hall or to the community centre for safety's sake.
- If we have the opportunity we will advise you of a lockdown on our Facebook page or via a text alert (so please keep these details
- Once a lockdown is over (and the police decide when that is) parents will be allowed into classrooms to collect their children. We will advise you of this on our Facebook page or text alert.
- Any students who are not collected by their parents who are frightened will come to the office and we will phone parents to come and collect them.
- Teachers will ensure the children leave with an adult or are suitably placed to get home safely.

Please DO NOT

- Ask to take your child.
- Try to engage any staff in conversation during or after the incident as their priority is keeping the children calm and safe.
- Demand that a teacher open a door to let you in or knock on windows or doors as this frightens the children.

After Wednesday's incident the staff met afterwards to debrief. After any incident like this, once we know the students are all safely on their way home the staff will meet to debrief. I am sure you understand that situations like this are scary not only for the kids but our staff as well, but they have to put the children's needs before their own, so a debrief is important to allow them to release some of the stress.

Thank you to everyone who worked with us during this incident and who allowed us to follow our procedures to ensure the safety of all our staff and students.
