
Curriculum Matters:

Numeracy: In number, students have started working on an algebra unit which they are finding quite challenging.

Writing: Students are continuing with a focus on improving our writing and some examples of student writing are included with this newsletter.

Science Badges: Year 6,7 & 8 students have been offered the opportunity to undertake science badge work as an extension activity.

This work is designed to be done independently by the students but should be completed within the term. The children area bale to choose a badge and then have to complete the activity sheet (completing at least 20 points); these are then marked and signed off by a teacher and badges awarded at a special assembly.
