

Principal's Piece

Dear Parents, Nga mihi nui ki a koutou,

"Each of us by our love and care leaves a mark on the life of others" - Pope Francis 2017. This quote by Pope Francis leads us beautifully into the St Leo's Mercy Value of AROHA, we are working on this term. Promoting how we can leave lots of "positive marks" on others and treat others with Aroha is reflected each week during our Prayer reflection. These messages are reinforced daily in our classrooms and the playground. I am always heartened to hear how our Mercy Values are acted upon in all aspects of our daily lives.

Our teachers are working in partnership with the students to help them understand what they need to learn and their next learning steps. This is an important step to empower our students in their learning. The concept of learner agency has had a profound impact on modern educational theory and practice. One way of thinking of learner agency is when learners have "the power to act". Agency is when learning involves the activity and the initiative of the learner. In the past, schools have catered mostly for groups of learners, for classes of kids, with a one size fits all approach. Current educational practice is moving the learners from being passive recipients to being much more active in the learning process, and actively involved in the decisions about the learning. This approach is more a partnership for learning between teacher and learner. This is learner agency.

Congratulations to Honor Braid, James Lynch, Lily McGivern and Louis Upton on winning the Peninsula Waterwise regatta. A great effort from you all. This is an outstanding achievement from these students who demonstrated a great sense of teamwork throughout the day. Also congratulations to both our rippa rugby teams who competed at the North Shore Rippa Rugby Field days. Both teams represented the school demonstrating our Mercy Values of Panekiritanga and Te Tapu o Te Tangata. The year 5 /6 team won all three games and the year 3/4 team won two of their three games.
