Kia ora koutou

There have been so many interesting learning opportunities for our students over the last week. We were very lucky with the weather for our field trips by the sea and what a lot of little creatures were found in the Estuary at Fortrose and in the Rocky Shore at Waipapa Point; crabs, starfish, baby octopus and a lot of sea living worms and crustaceans.

I was lucky enough to join the 21 senior students that attended the National Young Leaders Day in Dunedin on Monday. We joined hundreds of other children from schools throughout Otago and Southland at the Dunedin Town Hall. It was a fun day of listening and interacting with outstanding speakers who shared their amazing stories, making us all aware that with a passion we can achieve the seemingly impossible. The day was based around the whakatauki, "E kore au e ngaro he kakano I ruia mai I rangiatea" ("I am a seed born of greatness"). The speakers shared stories that helped the students to realise that no matter who they are, they too are a seed born of greatness.

Aaron Jackson, an actor who is on Shortland Street and in several movies including Pete's Dragon, shared his rocky start growing up with a Cleft Palate. His key messages were to be true to yourself and know that your opinion of you is what matters. We all need to be the best version of "me" that we can.

Daniel Flynn had an idea at age 19 and with no money, no qualification and almost no business experience he and two friends created a business where all of the profits from selling bottled water go to support countries that don't have ready access to clean water. The profit they make from "Thank you" water goes to building bores that will provide a clean supply of water. This was started in Australia and will soon be available in New Zealand. Look out for the 'Thank You' brand as all of the profits go to Charity!

The next speakers that really stood out for me were the two men, Adam Gardner and Duane Major, who were the initiators of the Give-A-Little campaign last summer, to buy a beach in Able Tasman. They were so passionate about this project and they took on what seemed like the impossible, but with social media and some traditional media interviews, they found a lot of people in New Zealand wanted to support this campaign to buy this beach for all New Zealanders to continue to enjoy. Their Code of Conduct included: 1. Give it a go. 2. Use your manners, smile and show respect. 3. Be honest and show integrity. 4. Give it everything. 5. Enjoy the ride.

Such great advice from people who live what they believe. The students also heard from former Silver Fern, Jodi Brown and Nomad who are a young group of musicians. I am sure that all of the students who attended will have taken some new learning home and I look forward to seeing them act on their dreams in the future.

Our Zone has met to plan for the Cross Country and Moffett Cup. Cross Country will be held at Woodlands on what looks to be an excellent course. The Moffett Cup is held next term on the 4th of August. We now have a city school in our Zone and two schools on the edge of town. This year will be the first year that Moffett Cup will be held in Invercargill. It has been decided that schools who are running events can choose where they will hold them based on what suits their Community best. The netball will be held in Stadium Southland and the rugby will be held at POB grounds in Lithgow Street. There will be no cost to the Zone for these venues. We talked about the traditions of Moffett Cup and have found some notes about its origin. This competition is almost 70 years old! If you know anything about Moffett Cup in the early days, please come and talk to me about it. I feel that it is important that the children of today know about the unique nature of this Competition.
