Principal's Comments:

Dear Families,

I would like to acknowledge and thank you all for your support in recent extra curricular activities. The support for the International Assembly was once again amazing. The students looked splendid in traditional costumes and the performances were all wonderful. It was also great to see so many families supporting their children in the annual cross country event, in what was ideal cross country conditions of gusty winds, passing showers and a bit of mud.

We have also had tremendous support with class trips recently and this is also much appreciated. We always have more parents wanting to support than we need and this is a great position to be in. Next week we are hosting 16 students from Te Akau ki Papamoa School. Thanks to the 7 families who are billeting these children for a night, which is a first for our school.

The Board is meeting this evening and we will finalise the design and purchase of climbing structures, shade and extra consumables.

On Tuesday, as some of you have seen, a temporary fence was erected on the bottom court up to the top of the field. On the inside of this fence a temporary road will be built so contractors can access the top of the field in winter to construct 3 new classrooms. Hopefully we will see the first stage of the build start in a week's time. The contractors predict the build will be completed by the end of September.

Over the past week and over the next few weeks, 6 families are leaving our school and moving to other suburbs or regions, or countries. We wish all these families well in their new surroundings. A special mention to the Stirling whanau who left last week. They have had a special connection with Belmont Primary over a long period of time with Erin's late father being our kaumatua for a long time. We wish Jayda-Belle and Michael all the best. Also a special mention to the Fairbank family who are leaving after

6 years at Belmont Primary. Thank you very much for your support and we wish Lois and Hannah all the best for their future schooling. We wish Felicity Wright and her family all the best for their new adventures in England. To all these families, thanks for all your support.

I would also like to bring to your attention a flyer associated with this newsletter about supporting a village in Samoa with some goods. An under 13 rugby team from North Shore is travelling to Samoa to play a Samoan Academy Side. As part of the experience they want to fill a container with goods and present these goods to the families of the village.
