

I hope our students enjoyed their extended Queen's Birthday weekend and once again I thank our families for supporting our opportunity to host a Teacher Only Day on Tuesday. This proved a very valuable day for our teaching staff. The initial focus was about writing and how we can look to develop an enduring passion for writing and expression in our students. Writing and having the ability to develop and convey ideas with clarity is seen as a critical precursor to achievement in the later years. All areas of learning have a requirement to be able to convey and express ideas with clarity to achieve, if this is in a verbal, written or artistic form. Developing and maintaining a confidence and freedom in developing and expressing ideas is essential through all levels of schooling and something we must continue to look to foster. Writing is identified as coming through as a weakness across all schools and could be linked to a significant decrease in incidental writing in our lives. No longer do we write to grandparents, have pen pals, use postcards or even copy down lyrics for our favourite songs. Writing tends to be confined to 140 characters or the selection of an emoji to try and reflect our emotional response to an event. Even the good old fashioned email is obsolete to most online users now. Trying to encourage and develop greater opportunities to write and express ideas at home will have lasting positive outcomes within education. Developments of personal blogs, writing to family, discussing events, drawing or painting for enjoyment and instead of a Facebook post, send a postcard while on holiday. These little opportunities will build towards continuing to develop the confidence in writing and expression. Hurunui College has highlighted this as an area of focus for the next three years and alongside our Community of Learning, we hope to better develop these skills in the years to come. Also on the day, our Year 8-13 teachers looked at the development of a more coherent concept based curriculum over the next three years. It is hoped this will help teachers to work more closely together, as well as allowing students to experience greater coherence and relevance between the traditional curriculum boundaries. In the afternoon our Year 11-13 teachers also looked at how we present NCEA courses and we are looking towards providing greater diversity and flexibility in how students' learning pathways may look over a year. We will be sharing more on this later in the year. We will also be looking to

have a follow-up afternoon on these focus areas next term and have scheduled an early finish on Wednesday 2nd August to allow some additional time to follow on from Tuesday's development.

A reminder to all parents and caregivers that the Year 11-13 Progress Evening is scheduled for next Thursday, 15th June. As we have shifted to on-going progress reporting this year, this is an essential opportunity for parents to talk one on one with subject teachers and gain a deeper understanding of the next steps for learning. Also if there are any who are still struggling with the online reporting, we will have a help desk available to talk through accessing our parent portal. If you have any questions about this please contact the school office.

Lastly, our two Hurunui College teams were knocked out during the quarterfinals of the North Canterbury Debating competition. It was still a great effort from both and they can be proud of how well they have done. Sadly we will not be able to defend the trophy again this year and will now leave it to the other schools to battle out for top honours.
