Parihaka Reconciliation Ceremony

Last Friday our whole school group was very well looked after at the Parihaka ceremony. We were greeted and welcomed onto the marae by Mrs Cassidy (Te Rauna and Mytalia's Nana). Even though the speeches during the ceremony were long, and mostly in Te Reo, our children were very well behaved and learnt a lot from the various phases throughout the day. There were moving parts to the ceremony, which included 'remembering those that had recently passed' and the grieving of past injustices particularly to the women left behind during the battles, when the Crown and British soldiers took away the men of Parihaka including their chiefs, and their land. We were not allowed to take any photos throughout the proceedings due to the sensitive nature of the 'reconciliation processes'.

One of the highlights was the involvement of our students Mytalia Cassidy, Te Rauna Cassidy, Te Awe Turahui and Alex Peihopa (who represented Eltham School with pride) when they were involved in presenting the members of Parliament and other dignitaries with gifts from the Parihaka trust, as a way of 'moving forward' and leaving the hurts from the past behind. This week our teachers have been going over the ceremony proceedings with our children to assist them to gain a better understanding of what occurred on the day at the ceremony. I know I speak on behalf of all the adults that attended, when I say how immensely honoured we all felt by being invited to attend this ceremony and witness such an act of forgiveness on behalf of the ancestors of Parihaka, and to take part in such a significant event in NZ history.

Community of Learning – Stratford Cluster

Last year I attended a significant number of meetings to help establish the Central Taranaki community of learning. There is a lot of work required to set these up under MOE guidelines and we are now beginning to undertake work and processes that will ultimately bring more coercion between local schools with the trickle down effect of providing better learning opportunities and support for our students.

Currently our cluster has been looking at transitioning of students from early childhood into primary school, from primary school to primary school (when families move locations or schools for various reasons) and from primary school to high school. We have been working with other schools in our area to try and structure a way that transitions can be better managed so schools get the information they need to assist students with optimal learning opportunities.

As a cluster we are also currently focusing on the various forms of assessment that schools use to track student progress. We are creating an assessment and student data schedule that will enable our primary schools to give our high schools relevant student information, to assist with cumulative record keeping. This will provide effective continuous learning opportunities and cumulative student profiles to enhance individual learning.
