

A big move forward in our School Wide Positive Behaviour for Learning (SWPB4L) this year has been the explicit teaching of our school values in relation to areas in the school. This came through very positively in our evaluation and review that was conducted a few weeks back and an additional recommendation was on how we are also sharing this information with our community. It was felt if we are trying to reinforce positive behaviour in these contexts at school it would be great if these expectations could also be supported at home. This term we have been focusing on Integrity and the setting we were focusing over the last two weeks has been the school buses. The buses are always an area that will need constant reinforcement of our school values and for students to show Integrity on the school bus is a great step forward. Integrity on the bus can be displayed by thanking the driver, being a role model to other students, displaying our wider school values and by also letting the school office know if students are not going to be on the school bus. The last teaching point continues to be an on-going issue that we all need to work on to ensure assumptions aren't made and students possibly left behind. We focus at school on Integrity being about doing the right thing because it is the right thing to do rather than because we have been told to do it. Being courteous and setting an example for others on the bus is about respecting the bus driver and others on the bus and about ensuring everybody feels safe and happy to travel to school. Any gentle reinforcement of these expectations at home would be greatly appreciated. An area that we can all focus on would be ensuring that we only do 20km/h when passing a stationary school bus. This is the law, but often is poorly abided by. We have had near misses in the past and we can all do our bit by slowing down to ensure that we do not have a devastating outcome around school buses.

There has been a notification that the alternative route north via Waipara will be diverted more directly through Waipara community and past Waipara School over the 26th – 29th June. This is to allow repairs to be carried out on the rail crossing on the main route. It is important that families and children in this community take extra

care during this time. This will be especially important when waiting for and exiting the school buses. When we are using this alternative route please be extra careful around Waipara School and any school buses.

This Friday signals the main fundraiser for our Area Schools Sports Representatives, at the Hawarden Rugby Club rooms. These students head away to Whangarei over the first week of the school holidays and will compete in Football, Rugby, Basketball, Volleyball and Golf. The quiz night is for teams of four and teams can be registered through the school office. There is a heap of prizes and some auction items up for grabs. It would be great to see a good turnout on the night.

Last but certainly not least our senior production Rock of Ages, is performed next week. It is promising to be a fantastic event and I would encourage all to get in quick to purchase tickets, as I'm sure it will be a sell-out.

NZQA Fees The NZQA fees of \$76.70 can now be paid. Full payment is due to the school office by Friday 4 August (Week 2, Term 3). Year 11-13 students must pay their fees to have their results from internal and external assessments recorded on their Record of Achievement, and to receive certificates. The School passes the fees to NZQA. Please pay the fees directly to the School Office. Cheques are to be made out to Hurunui College. Any money unpaid after 13 September incurs an additional \$50 fee, payable to NZQA. Financial assistance is available for all families holding a community services card and / or a WINZ benefit. The account will be reduced to \$20 per child with an approved financial assistance application.
