Holy Week


The last week of Lent is known as Holy Week. It is when Christians remember the last week of Jesus' life and is the most important time in the Christian year. There are many church services and processions.







Our school has been able to secure professional development and funding to support literacy learning, it is called ALL. This is similar to AliM, which I have taught for the last two years. Next term I will start a 15 week programme working with three different groups of students in the school, and while this is happening Heather Dowling will teach in my class (4 afternoons a week). I will be writing to each family next week if your child is involved in this. It is an exciting opportunity for us all, and I am looking forward to starting this. The focus will be on writing.
