**Weigh in starts at 12pm and closes at 2.30pm Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> July**

- 1) Paid entry is acceptable of all rules & conditions.
- 2) All animals **MUST** be caught in the wild during the stated days of the competition.
- 3) No chilled, frozen or hosed down animals will be accepted.
- 4) No tampered or domesticated animals accepted.
- 5) Entry forms will be accepted until Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> July @ 9pm.
- 6) Competition starts Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July
- 7) All participants enter at their own risk. Tinui Cafe & Bar will not be responsible or liable for injury or misadventure during this competition.
- 8) All prize winners **must be present** and claim their own prize, unclaimed prizes will be used as spot prizes.
- 9) Hunting is open to all areas.
- 10) All boars' **pizzles, testicles and offal are to be removed.**
- 11) **Weigh in starts at 12pm and closes at 2.30pm Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> July.**
- 12) For jaws to be eligible for best jaw prize, mouths must be open to enable measurement if necessary.
- 13) All stags to be weighed with pizzles, testicles, offal, head and hocks removed. Ears intact must be attached to the carcass.
- 14) Animals of equal weights, the first weighed in takes superior honour.
- 15) All animals weighed in must be caught or shot by the person weighing the animal in.
- 16) One animal/entrant in each class to be weighed in (except for the most of ie. Magpies)
