#### **Dear Parents and Caregivers**

We often forget that children aren't born with a built-in sense of respect for others. While each child has a different personality, all children need to be taught to be respectful. From birth,

children learn to manipulate their world to get their needs met - this is natural. But it is the job of adults to teach them respectful ways to do this.

As with all behaviours, children learn by watching those adults in their lives, and it is therefore important that we model respectful behaviours in our interactions with all children and other adults. An important aspect, is to show respect for those rules that enable us to function as part of a community. It can be something as basic as using the pedestrian crossing when dropping off and picking up your child to and from school. If we don't use the crossing, are we giving our children mixed messages and telling them that they can pick and choose the rules and laws they should or should not follow?

It's important to remember that our children are not our friends. It is our job to teach them to be able to function in the world. It is our job to teach them to behave respectfully to others, not just us.
