

Well, we've made it to the middle of the year and Term 3, longer days and spring is now just around the corner. As always it has proven to be a very busy term with lots happening in the school. The term kicked off with the Exploring Community Camps in Arthurs Pass and culminated with the Secondary Production at the end of last week, and what a fantastic production it was. I was very impressed by the professionalism of the cast and crews and the degree of complexity within the scenes. There seemed to always be two or three things happening on stage at any one time, making the producing of the production a whole lot more difficult for both cast and crews. A big congratulation to Sarah Cassidy for producing the show, very closely supported by Philip Biddlecombe, our music teacher. To the rest of the cast and crew, ka mau te wehi (outstanding)!

The school focus for this week has been around showing Integrity in the Library and what this should look like in the school. Teachers have discussed this with students and looked at such things as no food or drink in the Library, keeping the library clean and returning items on time and after use. The library is one of our larger shared spaces and an area we must work together to ensure we make the best use of it. Students need to also be aware that the library is a community space and that we need to be considerate of outside users coming into the library. At yesterday's assembly, I also talked to the school about Integrity with a major focus on rubbish. It has become apparent that we are rubbish about looking after our rubbish at Hurunui College. Although the students do not bring the large majority of rubbish into the school, they certainly contribute to the majority of rubbish that is left around the school grounds. Chippie packets, food wrappers, orange peels, and glad wrap makes up the most of what gets blown and left around the school. Although we can do rubbish duties and school-wide clean ups, this does not address the problem on how and why the rubbish is getting there in the first place. In many cases it is not intentional, but relates more to absent mindedness and not dealing with the rubbish when it is created; but whatever the cause, it is still there. We will focus next term on trying to change our mindsets around rubbish and families can do their bit to help. Using reusable containers, removing wrappers and peeling oranges prior to going into the lunch box will make a significant difference to what could be left around the school. The more we can prevent rubbish and especially plastics ending up in our ditches and drains the better off our environment will be.

I will do a feature early next term on our local sporting representatives. If you do have a child who has achieved a higher honour and it is likely that we might not know about it at school please get in touch or drop us an email so that they are not missed out. Also a reminder that on Wednesday 2nd August the school will be having an early finish to follow up on work done at the teacher only day earlier in the term. Students will be released at 2.00pm and bus students can expect to be home an hour earlier.

Lastly, we wish our Area School Sports Representatives all the best as they head off to Whangarei on Sunday to compete at the Area Schools National Sporting Tournament. We know they will do us proud.

NZQA Fees The NZQA fees of \$76.70 can now be paid. Full payment is due to the school office by Friday 4 August (Week 2, Term 3). Year 11-13 students must pay their fees to have their results from internal and external assessments recorded on their Record of Achievement, and to receive certificates. The School passes the fees to NZQA. Please pay the fees directly to the School Office. Cheques are to be made out to Hurunui College. Any money unpaid after 13 September incurs an additional \$50 fee, payable to NZQA. Financial assistance is available for all families holding a community services card and / or a WINZ benefit. The account will be reduced to \$20 per child with an approved financial assistance application. Financial assistance is also available to families having MORE than two children entered for NCEA qualifications either here or at other schools. Contact the school office for an application form.

After Hours There is always a doctor or rural nurse specialist on call - please phone the Health Centre on the number below during normal business hours and after hours and you will be directed to the appropriate assistance. The After Hours calls are managed by HML (Homecare Medical Ltd) who will assess your needs and advise your best course of action. The on call clinician is able to access patient records, if required, to improve patient safety.

HPV Vaccine This is now funded (FREE) for both males and females. 9-26 years of age. HPV immunisation protects against infection from the types of HPV that cause most cervical, anal and genital cancers, as well as some mouth and throat cancers. Please phone the practice nurse if you have any questions about the vaccination programme.

Earthquake Recovery Team If you would like to talk to someone about your experience and ongoing anxiety/stress there is a service operating in our area which could see you free of charge. There are also people available who can help you navigate through insurance and other issues. Please phone the Health Centre if we can assist you in connecting with these services.

Respiratory Illness Review Are you a smoker or ex-smoker over 40 and do you have more than your fair share of coughs and get out of breath easily? If the answer is Yes please ring us and ask for a respiratory questionnaire.

Dietician Janice Bremer – has a clinic 3 August at Waikari – please talk to the practice nurse if you are interested in a referral.

Green Prescription – need help with being active over the winter months? We have a local co-ordinator who can support you .

Julia Home – Podiatrist next clinic 21st July. Free for over 65 year olds.

Equipment Amnesty – we are missing some crutches. If you have these items please return as soon as possible.

Gold Coin Donation For Admission, All Welcome for ACC and Medical visits for enrolled patients.

Flu Vaccine This is now available and is free for; pregnant women, people with certain chronic conditions and for people 65 years and over. Also for children under 18 who are registered at a Hurunui Practice (earthquake recovery). Please make an appointment with the nurse.

Shingles Vaccine (Zostavax) is available for people over the age of 50. It costs \$200 and we have some available, please phone the nurse if you are interested in more information about this.

Drivers Licence medicals – people need a medical to renew their licence at age 75,80 and every two years after that. Truck and Bus licences are renewed every five years and once you turn 65 it is annual. Please advise the receptionist if you are booking a drivers licence medical.
