This year we will be holding our school Pet Day on the first week of Term 4. We will return to school on Monday 16th October. Tuesday 17th October we will craft all of our creations for the pet day craft competitions (details will be sent out and a certain amount of preparation over the holidays is allowed). On Tuesday after school the crafts will be judged with results displayed on Wednesday 18th October.

This year our Pet Day will be held on Wednesday 18th October, with judging of animals commencing at 10.30am. It is a compulsory school day and we strongly encourage every student to have a pet to participate with on the day. You are able to raise a lamb, calf or kid born between the 20th July and 25th September.
