



Welcome back to Term three. It was also fitting that the focus was on volunteers as we sadly farewelled Elisa and Nils from Hurunui College on Tuesday. It is amazing to think that Nils and Elisa have completed a year with us as volunteers at the school and now head home back to Germany. They have been an amazing asset to the school, have done a fabulous job and will be sadly

missed. It is a huge leap of faith to travel half way around the world to work in a school, community and country that you know very little about. The way both Nils and Elisa integrated into our community was a huge credit to them and I know they have touched the lives of more than just those of us in the school. We wish them all the best on the journey home and as always, will take a little part of Hurunui College back to Germany with them and the knowledge that they will always be warmly welcomed back. This was also symbolised through the presenting of a Pounamu to both after a moving Haka from the students.

A reminder to all families that next Wednesday 2nd August, the school is closing at 2 pm. This is to allow staff a greater opportunity to follow up on initiatives discussed at our teacher only day last term. Buses will be running an hour earlier and parents and caregivers can expect children to be returning home an hour earlier than normal.

Lastly congratulations to our team of Area School Sporting representative who headed off to Whangarei in the first week of the school holidays. The team had a great week up north and managed to avoid the bad weather that plagued the majority of the country. Well done to all the students who made South Island teams and congratulations to Flynn Crean and Blair Norton who were selected in the NZ Barbarians Area Schools Rugby Team and Jackson Bau who was selected into the NZ Area Schools Football Team. All fabulous achievements!

NZQA Fees The NZQA fees of \$76.70 can now be paid. Full payment is due to the school office by Friday 4 August (Week 2, Term 3). Year 11-13 students must pay their fees to have their results from internal and external assessments recorded on their Record of Achievement, and to receive certificates. The School passes the fees to NZQA. Please pay the fees directly to the School Office. Cheques are to be made out to Hurunui College. Any money unpaid after 13 September incurs an additional \$50 fee, payable to NZQA. Financial assistance is available for all families holding a community services card and / or a WINZ benefit. The account will be reduced to \$20 per child with an approved financial assistance application. Financial assistance is also available to families having MORE than two children entered for NCEA qualifications either here or at other schools. Contact the school office for an application form.




