Key Curriculum Principles @ St Leo's Catholic School

These 4 guiding principles determine our curriculum, what and how we teach.

- Student Agency: Giving students the power to act and have ownership
 of their learning. Each learning space and the school grounds
 themselves belong not to teachers but to all, equally.
