If you leave a text message after 1.15p.m. and you do not get a reply, please try again to make sure the message was received. I will normally text back a quick reply to say OK we got the message.


Congratulations

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ


I believe in the Holy Spirit

New Physical Activity Guidelines for children and young people (5-17 years)

I recently read an article on this in the Education Gazette, and below are some of the key points made.

- Up to one in four NZ children do not get enough sleep
- Children who don't get enough sleep can be hyperactive, impulsive and have a short attention span, as well as be more sedentary and significantly less active than those children getting adequate sleep.

A healthy 24 hours should include

- uninterrupted good-quality sleep of nine to eleven hours per night, with consistent bed and wake-up times
- an accumulation of at least one hour per day of moderate to vigorous physical activity
- no more than 2 hours screen time.

In our busy lives, it is important to keep the basics of good eating, sleeping and regular exercise happening. As our childrens most important role model, lets try and lead the way and show them how to look after themselves well.

The other team had the ball and we got lots of rips and then it was turn over.


This was our chance... the ball got passed to me, I sprinted down the field and I got to the try line and scored! I heard heavy breathing right behind me – phew! That was a close one.
