Dear Bayview Families, ENROLMENT SCHEME

Our roll is currently sitting at 398 students! We are due to go over the 400 mark in the next few weeks. As you know our roll has been growing for quite some time and we have been liaising with the Ministry of Education around the space required to accommodate all our students.

I have indicated earlier this year that the MoE have asked us to implement an enrolment scheme. In consultation with us the MoE has developed a draft enrolment zone and I have included this with today's newsletter. There are larger copies of the map displayed at school, one in the office and one outside the radio station. This is also available on our school website.

All members of the community as well as neighbouring schools are able to make comment about the proposed scheme and should do so before 3rd September. Comments need to be made in writing to the Bayview School Board of Trustees.

The zone takes effect from the beginning of the 2018 school year. We will have a number of out of zone places available to accommodate as many out of zone students as our physical space allows. Please be mindful of when you will need to enrol new students and watch out for newsletters advertising cut off dates for enrolment applications.

KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE TERM 3

This week we have started learning about 'Keeping Ourselves Safe'. When these lessons are being taught there will be homelink activities brought home for the children to complete with you. Please take the time to sit with your child and ask them about what they are learning and complete the activities together. This is the best way to help reinforce the very important safety messages we are trying to instil in the children.

ATTENDANCE RATES

Our overall attendance rate for this year is sitting at 93%. The classes with the best attendance rates are habitat 4.5, 8, 14, and 17 with 94% attendance. Over all girls attendance is sitting at 94% with boys at 93%.

PROPERTY RATIONALISATION

During the break I met with the Ministry of Education around our roll growth and the need for more classrooms. There is high demand in Auckland for relocatable classes that can be dropped onsite. The Ministry have had to problem solve around this and have decided to upgrade Habitats 4 and 5 at their cost. These classrooms will be reroofed, Habitat 5 will be re-carpeted, and both classes will be re-painted internally. The MoE will ensure they are insulated properly and will be of a standard required to be used as fully functioning classes. We are trying to get this work done during the next break, but this may not be possible so may happen once school is back in term 4. These classes will then be used up until the MoE build us new classrooms around 2019/2020 (after which H4 and 5 will be demolished). On the positive side this is a great problem to have! ©

NEW STAFF

This term we have two new teachers joining us. Mr Parag Bhatt is our new Classroom Release Teacher working in every class in the school. Parag has a background working with special needs students and has already impressed us by teaching some classes sign language!

On Monday 7th August we welcome Mrs Donna Jamieson who is starting a new Y0 class. Donna has a lot of experience working in the Y0/1 area. Donna will be working alongside Amy Craddock in Habitat 1 next week and then will be starting her new class in Habitat 3 from 14th August. I know Donna would love some play things for her class so if anyone is having a clean out and would like to donate toys please bring them to the office or take them straight to Habitat 3.

Depending on enrolments we may need to start a further Y0 class in term 4, so fingers crossed H4 and 5 are ready by then!
