

Papakowhai School Learning Together

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Week 3 ● Term 3 ● 9th August 2017

Dear Parents/Caregivers

The Ministry of Education have put together a summary of the feedback they received in Term 1 this year about roll growth in North Porirua, particularly Aotea. There is a survey on the Ministry's website that is only open until **Friday 18 August 2017**. I understand this is the final opportunity for consultation. https://education.govt.nz/ministry-of-education/consultations-and-reviews/aotea-north-porirua-future-schooling-provision/. The Ministry state that a decision will be made in Term 4 2017.

The Ministry identified these options and released them to us on Friday last week. The Board of Trustees have not had an opportunity to meet to discuss them. We are meeting as a BOT on Wednesday 16th August at 7pm. My comments as the Principal of Papakowhai School are in italics.

Short Term Options

- Enforce zoning for all north Porirua primary schools: There will be a review of school zones, including a new zone for Rangikura School, once a final decision is made. Papakowhai School is not changing its zone for 2018 but we are expecting to reduce our zone for the 2019 school year.
- Increase capacity of existing primary schools: The Ministry are adding additional classrooms to Rangikura School and at Papakowhai School. Totara Block will be redeveloped and modernised to create four classroom spaces instead of the existing three. It will look similar to Kauri. This work will happen over the summer and the block will be ready to occupy in Term 2 2018. There is no plan to add any additional classrooms after this development.

Longer Term Options

• Option 1

Year 7 - 13 provision at Aotea College, in conjunction with creating a new Year 1 - 6 primary school. For this option to be viable a number of schools would need to agree to change their provision to Year 1 - 6.

Options 2 and 3

Increase Year 1-8 provision either by creating a new primary school (Option 2) or a new second campus of Papakowhai (Option 3), with development to occur either at/near Aotea College. Papakowhai's zone would likely be affected in all permutations of this option. If a new, independent school is built, then the Papakowhai zone would likely be changed. This could potentially be to the midway point between Papakowhai and new school site but would need to be determined in consultation with Papakowhai and other affected schools. If a second campus of Papakowhai is built, then Papakowhai's zone would be extended to include all of the Aotea development. It may also be necessary to review the zones of other nearby schools, including Rangikura. Participants also requested information about the second campus option. If a second campus of Papakowhai were created, it would be equipped with its own full set of resources (technology, fields, etc). The survey asks for your preferences on how a second campus should be organised. The sites could be split by student years (a junior campus for Years 1 – 4, and a senior campus for Years 5 – 8), or by geography (in which case each site would offer Years 1 - 8). The second campus would be

managed by the Board and Principal of Papakowhai, and they would determine any additional leadership requirements for the second campus.

A zone set at a "midway point between Papakowhai and new school site (at or near Aotea College)" would mean a school of 450+ in Aotea and a school of about 150 in Papakowhai. This raises concerns for me about the long term viability of Papakowhai School and difficulties managing an interim period of 3-5 years while a new school is established and built. To rebalance the rolls of the schools a significant proportion of Aotea would need to be zoned for Papakowhai School. The Ministry have not yet had any discussions with Papakowhai School about the second campus option.

Option 4

Establish Year 7-10 middle schooling and Year 11-13 senior schooling

This would involve changing the year levels of Aotea College to Years 7-13, and creating a Year 7-10 middle school campus and a Year 11-13 senior secondary campus on the current Aotea College site. The campuses would be configured in a way that provides separation for younger and older students. To create a viable middle school model and address the roll growth pressure facing schools across younger year levels, a number of schools would need to change to Year 1-6 to create capacity for future growth.

They have made a great start on stopping erosion and beautifying our banks. The children showed fabulous enthusiasm and participation. It was fantastic to be utilising school-made compost with very impressive worm population! This will be an ongoing, long term project for enhancing our natural landscape and creating a lizard habitat. Well done Kauri!
