

How a Volcano Erupts

A volcanic eruption occurs when two tectonic plates are crushed together or pulled apart from each other. An eruption holds rocks, magma and lava.

During a volcanic eruption the two tectonic plates are crushed together and pulled apart then magma will slowly creep up the volcano. When the tectonic plates goes on top of one another the one under gets scorching hot then melts into blistering magma.

When the magma chamber is getting emptied the scorching hot magma is rising up the volcano. The magma passes the volcanoes open vents and gets sprayed out. When the magma reaches oxygen it gets called lava.

The lava can slowly pour out of the volcano or the lave can explode out of the volcano. Lava carries deadly dissolved gas, rocks and some shiny crystals. The lave them hardens up and forms land.

As the blistering hot lava hardens up it will slowly turn into land. The land can form many shapes and sizes after an eruption. Volcanic eruptions are caused from tectonic plates them magma slowly rises and the lava pours out then hardens up and forms land.


