Tena koutou katoa/Hello everyone

Our Maths afternoon on Tuesday was successful as a vehicle to help Caregivers to understand some of the strategies that are taught throughout the school. We wanted to show the progress as children moved up through the levels and to teach parents some of the terminology and ways that we teach concepts that may be different to when they were at school. It was interesting, from a teachers perspective to find that parents didn't realise that children are taught at the level they are at. This means that there is not whole class teaching where children have to do what is expected at their age no matter what they are ready for; children are grouped and taught at the level they are at, no matter what class they are in. It is to be expected that we are all at different stages in our learning; we haven't all had the same experiences that help our understandings and it is normal for children to progress at different rates. We notice that children will have times when they steam ahead and then they might plateau for a while; much like how they grow physically where we notice growth spurts. While the teachers demonstrated strategies from a stage that they teach in their class, they normally teach from at least three stages to cater for all of the children's needs. If you want to take home some Maths games like the ones demonstrated, call in at the Office and you can borrow some.

Meal time! Talk time! Did you know that eating a meal together as a family with the television turned off is incredibly important in terms of healthy eating and being mindful of what you are doing? Did you also know that the simple act of sharing a meal can improve your children's vocabulary? Family therapist Anne Fishel says researchers have found that for young children, conversations at the dinner table boost vocabulary even more than being read to. Researchers counted the number of "rare words" – those not found on a list of 3000 most common words – that the family used during dinnertime chats. It may seem odd, especially if you feel like the only things you say during dinnertime are, "Sit down!" and "Pass me the salt, please", but young children learned 1000 rare words at the dinner table, compared with only 143 from parents reading aloud from a book. Vocabulary is important with helping children to read. Children who have a large vocabulary read earlier and more easily. Reading to children is still important though.

Jason Gray - Infield Group


