Athletic Sports

This is an exciting step in their learning journey, but saying goodbye is never easy ... so we'll just have to make the most of our time left together.

Exciting news!

The senior class is going to become guardians to 5 beautiful beef-cross calves, which have kindly been donated to us from the Maniototo Dairy Farm. We will be keeping these calves in one of the parish paddocks, and feeding them and befriending them ready for a child run auction at the end of the year (coached by local star auctioneer Ryan Dowling) so be ready to be blown away by their high speed, selling lingo! Homework
