- 1. Ensure your child has a quiet and comfortable place to study away from distraction. This may be the kitchen table or a table area in the bedroom. Turn TV's off and put cell phones aside during this time. Quiet music can be beneficial.
- 2. Encourage study to be focused. Help them structure and spend a set amount of time on each exam preparation and allow short breaks every 30/40mins.
- 3. Ensure your child receives adequate sleep. Late nights and broken sleep are not conducive to study and achievement in exams.
- 4. Encourage them to hold off on any celebrations until after they have finished all of their exams. A little sacrifice over the next few weeks may make a huge difference.




