HEALTH CONSULTATION AT HURUNUI COLLEGE

Under Section 60B of the Education Act 1989 (as amended in 2001), Boards of Trustees are required to produce a written statement about how the school will implement health education, inform the school community about the content of the health education components of the curriculum and consult with members of the school community regarding the way in which the school should implement health education.

The process of this consultation requires information on the proposed health education programme being presented to the school community, providing an opportunity for the school community to comment, then comments being considered before confirming the health education programme.

Health and Physical Education in the New Zealand

Curriculum Health and Physical education is one of the eight essential learning areas of The New Zealand Curriculum. Furthermore, it is a compulsory subject until the end of Year ten. An outline is being sent home to all parents.

Community Feedback

The Community Health Consultation Google survey is an opportunity for parents/caregivers to comment on the

proposed Health programme and provide feedback, concerns, or issues in writing to the school. Any such comments will be treated as confidential to the Health team and will be considered when making final amendments to the Health programme. The survey can be accessed via Google forms, the link for this will be posted on the school website and Facebook page. Alternatively, a written letter including your views can be addressed to the Health Department – c/o the school office.

Failing all or any of these Trusts no longer existing that portion or all of the funds to be transferred to the Hurunui District Council for use within the Hurunui District for charitable purposes consistent with the objectives of the Friends of Waikari Hospital.
