The teachers have been completing assessments with children over the last couple of weeks. They use these along with what they have observed in class and what they can see in the student's books and online, to make Overall Teacher Judgements that decide where they are in terms of the National Standards. As a staff and Board we look at the overall data to see where we think that there are gaps and plan what we need to do to help raise achievement in any areas that show a deficit. We are also noting the progress that students have made. This is most important, as a child may not move over the National Standard line but may have made some excellent progress. Reports will be sent home with the children in the last week of term.




Museum Garden Cleanup


