Dear Parents/Caregivers

Cyber Safety

There are some alarming things that students are doing on the internet without thinking of the consequences. We have found that many of our students have multiple social media accounts. In most of these cases, they are unaware of the need to set adequate privacy settings. In other cases, students are even sharing social media accounts meaning that they all have the same passwords and can access the account. There are also instances where students share passwords. The consequences of this type of behaviour are not understood by young people, this is why many of the social media sites have a minimum age of 13, and parent consent is often required. We have worked with the Police and over the last two weeks, senior students have been involved in an education programme that includes cyber safety.

Cyber Safety will now be an important part of our local curriculum and we will involve our community. In the meantime, we would ask that parents work with your children to ensure that they understand safe practices when using social media sites. They may also need help with ensuring that privacy settings are adequate.

<u>Please note that no social media sites are able to be accessed at school.</u>

Where can parents get help?

The best site for assistance is Net Safe NZ - https://www.netsafe.org.nz . Your classroom teacher is always prepared to help.

Early in 2018, we will run an information evening for parents on cyber safety and this will include some basic assistance with privacy settings on social media sites.
