



Last Thursday, at our final full school assembly we farewelled our departing senior students and in particular our Year 13s from the school. From within this group it was also special to farewell five Hurunui College survivors, who have completed their entire schooling at Hurunui College. This is a very special milestone and something they can be very proud of. The school certainly now has a very different feel about it with our Year 11-13 off on exam leave. NCEA exams started for a few of our students on Friday and have got into full swing this week, with the English Level 1 exams being held on Monday. The exams continue over the next three weeks and we wish our students all the best and hope they take all the opportunities available to them to perform at their best. There is a recognised concern that can be best described as exam creep, as these exams are continually being pushed earlier and earlier into term four. This concern has been reiterated by principals across the country but has not yet been addressed by NZQA. We have such limited time with our NCEA students in term four and we are reluctant to lose more of this time.

I spent my Monday at Wellington Airport meeting with the Area School executive and a number of Ministry of Education representatives; the head of the school funding review team and the ERO chief executive. A key aspect of the funding review is the removal of the decile rating and it being replaced by targeted funding based on actual achievement risk factors. Since the publication of decile ratings, there has been a condensing of at-risk students in certain schools, strongly influenced by what has been termed "white flight". The decile funding is simply based on general wealth and does not adequately support these schools to meet these increased needs. It will be interesting to see how this review is implemented without further stigmatising our schools who are dealing with our most atrisk students.

It was fantastic to hear this week that Miriam Clark has been selected to be part of the Sir Peter Blake Expedition in 2018. The expedition is for young people with a passion for science, the environment, and conservation. On their adventure, they'll participate in significant scientific, environmental, and heritage restoration projects. In 2018 they will travel to the Kermadec Islands and is just reward

for Miriam's passion and the work she has done for the environment locally. She will follow in her sister's (Anna Clark) footsteps who completed a similar voyage in 2012.

While we are talking about achievements, after a year of hard work four students went with Sarah Cassidy to their singing examinations last week. Bri Hodgen and Maggie Ferguson took their grade 3 exam and both passed and Jacob Ward and Katie Gunn took their grade 6 and both achieved merits. A massive congratulation to all as this is a fabulous achievement. Thank you to Sarah for all her hard work getting them to this point.

Lastly, well done to all who competed in the Hurunui Primary Schools Athletics on Tuesday. By all accounts, our school did exceptionally well and had a great day in Culverden. Good luck to those who are going on to Canterbury's in the coming weeks.
