It is hard to believe that there is only one full week of school left before the end of the year. Prizegiving plans are in full swing and before we know it the summer break will be upon us. The full school Prizegiving will be held on Tuesday 12th December. We ask that all parents, caregivers and community who wish to attend, please aim to be seated by 10.15 am, with a start time for the Prizegiving being 10.30 am. We are expecting prizegiving to be shorter this year and to be completed by 12 pm. The buses will run at 12.30 pm for those who are not intending to head home with family. Parents and caregivers, please be aware that students will be home approximately two and half hours earlier on Prizegiving day. It is important that parents ensure ALL students are in correct uniform as this will be checked prior to the start of the Prizegiving. This is especially important for our Year 11-13 students. We ask that all students present themselves in correct uniform, respectfully and portray the positive image of the school.

Over the last couple of days, I have had the pleasure of spending a few days up at Loch Katrine with the Year 8 class (below right), with our Year 10 students heading up to Lake Taylor today. It was a fantastic few days away with spectacular weather in an area that is very special and unique to our community. Kayaking, swimming, boating and walking is a pretty tough way to spend a couple of days. A focus of our school's strategic plan this year and something that came through from our community consultation was to better connect with our local environment and the culmination of these trips puts a big tick in this box and gives us a template for further trips in the future. Being away on this trip once again reminds me of the benefits of these types of trips and what the students can learn out of them and what we can learn about the students. Three days away on an Outdoor Ed camp can teach you more about a group of students than what can be learned over a year in the classroom and the experiences and learning opportunities the students have are immeasurable. A big thank you to the class for letting me come along and to all the staff and parents who made the camp a success.

It is fantastic to see that the main school pool has opened this week mostly without the dramas we have experienced over the last couple of years with either water loss of earthquake damage. The Cowie Pool will remain closed

while the source of a leak is identified and hopefully repaired. The pool committee has done a fantastic job getting the pool ready this year, especially with the new lick of paint that has been applied over the last couple of weeks. The pool is a fantastic resource for the school and community and it is essential that everybody respects the rules around the use of the pool. It is a useful time to remind all that access to the pool is via a purchased key or by gold coin entry. If you do not have a key and the pool is empty, you are unable to gain access. If you want easy access, the best way is to purchase a key. It is also important to remember that any students under 16 years of age must be supervised at the pool. This means that there must be somebody there designated to supervise the swimmer, not just somebody else at the pool. Please do not drop children under 16 off at the pool thinking that somebody might be there. Lastly, no swimming alone and please refrain from throwing stones or other items into the pool that might damage the paintwork.

Lastly, a big congratulation to one of our previous students Nisha Joliffe who has been accepted into Toi Whakaari: the NZ Drama School up in Wellington, for its 3-year course. This is a prestigious school and entry is highly competitive and extremely sort after. This is a fantastic achievement for Nisha and we wish her all the best for the next three years. Another great example of a Hurunui student excelling on the national stage.



for the season. The Hawarden Swimming Club would like to thank all the people who helped with the draining, cleaning, water blasting, acid washing and painting of the pool. It was a huge effort from a large number of Club and community members. Unfortunately the Cowie pool is out of action and cannot be used. To protect the new paint work, please do not go in that pool.

The Swimming Club runs the school-owned pool to make it available to the community. Unlike many public pools that are open for set hours, with paid supervisors, we rely on the integrity of our users to have the pool available every day from sunrise to sunset, except school hours and when the Swimming Club has events. The pool is also closed on Sunday mornings

for cleaning. The pool is open when the covers are off. Please wait for the volunteer pool operators to remove the covers each day.

Individuals or families can either pay \$60 to have a pool key for the season, or pay \$2 per swimmer per day, into the honesty box, if there is a keyholder there to let you in.

If you have a key from last season you can pay for your key by Internet Banking, to 03 1582 0012259 00 using your key number as the code and your surname as the reference.

Keys can be purchased from Paul Munnerley (027 630-4747), Bronwyn Gunn (314-4411) or the Hawarden Library (314-4652).

Please take care entering the pool – grass seed has been planted outside the entrance where new underground power has been installed. Approach the pool gate from the Bowling Club side of the pool area.

The Club will not be running a Learn to Swim Week this season, but Sue Trumper is offering tuition to individuals or groups. Contact Sue, 314-4232 for more information.


