## Welcome back to school and our 2018 year of learning

Happy New Year and welcome back to school! We are excited about all of the wonderful things we will be teaching your children this term in relation to identity. We will have swimming every day except Fridays up until Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> March which is when our Swimming Sports event will be held. (Postponement day is Friday 9<sup>th</sup> March) If for any reason your child is NOT swimming please send a note to your childs teacher. We encourage all of our children to swim daily in order to gain confidence in the water and learn swimming skills. Immediately after swimming sports we will begin athletics. Our athletics will run for three weeks with the Athletics Day being on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> March (postponement day Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> March). Good Friday is the 30<sup>th</sup> of March where school will break for 5 days before returning for a remaining two weeks of term one. The final day of term one is Friday 13<sup>th</sup> April.

## **National Standards**

You have possibly been keeping up with the media attention the education sector has received of late, mostly due to the dropping of National Standards. There have been reports that National Standards have been removed, and there is nothing currently in place from the Labour government to replace them with. Before National Standards were introduced schools used the NZ Curriculum to make judgements about 'where children were at' academically and this will certainly continue at Eltham School. We will be guided by the Ministry of Education around any form of future assessment, but we are confident in our decisions regarding the assessment of your children in the interim.

## **Central Taranaki Community of Learning Update**

The Central Taranaki Kahui Ako Acheievement Challenge Plan has now been forwarded to the Ministry of Education for sign off. The plan has been approved by the Boards of Trustees of all the schools in the Kahui Ako and consulted on by teachers through out our community.





## Holiday Happenings...

There were a large number of property projects that were attended to over the school holidays. The exteriors of our buildings were washed and both the junior block and the Admin Block were repainted. We're thrilled with how smart and tidy they both look, and how well matched they are to the rest of the school.







All of our classrooms and interior buildings were carpet shampooed. We have had a concept design drawn up for the C Block (Junior block) building renovations. This has yet to be submitted to the Ministry of Education for approval, and we will keep you up to date with the progress of those renovations. In the meantime Room 8 (Mrs Crowe's class) are 'temporarily boarding' in the senior block – they will be moving to the junior block – Room 3 or 4 when the renovations have been completed.

However we will be sure to secure someone to carry out this work for us soon, as we would like our road frontage to be completed to tie in with the Arches work in order to create an attractive and welcoming front road appearance.

Many schools throughout NZ already use this tool and there has been a great amount of positive feedback about it. Parents like being able to view and comment on their children's work and progress. We will be sending home the information and how you can sign up very soon, or you may receive an email from your child's teacher if you have an email account.
