Swimming Sports

Our School Swimming Sports will be held at Point Erin Pools, Tuesday 22 February.

Year 7 Classes Assemble on the Basketball Courts 8.35am – walk to Point Erin Pools where the

programme begins at 9.00am.

Year 7 students will finish the programme at 12:00pm, have lunch at Point Erin Park and wait until Years 8's have entered the pool.

Year 8 Classes Assemble on the Basketball Courts 11:00am at the end of Interval. Walk to

Point Erin Pools where the programme starts at 12:15pm. Finish at 2.30pm and

walk back to school.

Students will need: Swimming togs, Towel, Sweater or Rain jacket, Sunhat, Sunscreen, Lunch and a

Drink (in plastic container).

Championships will be held in Backstroke, Breaststroke, Freestyle and Butterfly. All events are 33 metres in length, apart from 100m Freestyle. There are 2 fun races. All students should enter at least 2 events, and will accumulate House Points.

2018 Costs

NB: Subject to review

To maintain the high standard of facilities and the educational opportunities/programmes our school now offers, it is necessary to supplement the grant we receive from the Ministry of Education with specific funding via student costs. The Ministry of Education grant does not provide for any of the 'extras' or 'frills' of the educational programme/resources we provide.

We are very aware of the expenses facing parents/caregivers at the beginning of the school year. We have therefore tried to keep costs as low as possible. We are also aware that schools have a terrible habit of asking for money throughout the year for various reasons and know that this becomes an inconvenience for parents/caregivers.

For 2018 we pledge that the total cost asked for now will cover all costs for the entire year's activities/trips with the exception of the Term 4 Class Camp. However there are additional costs for activities such as – Ski Team, Hockey, Netball, Basketball, ICAS exam etc...

Yes, that is correct! We will not ask for money for trips, fundraising activities, educational excursions etc...

Below is a breakdown of costs. The total amount is \$580.00 for the year or \$145.00 per term.

We thank you for your support and trust this format of payment makes it easier for you.

Activity costs are expenses that all schools would collect at the beginning of the year and for such things as Special Events/Trips, Special Programmes, etc. and throughout the year as events occur.

School Donation is optional although we obviously encourage you to pay this and appreciate it greatly if you do. School Donations can be claimed back on your annual tax return.

Costs and Donations can be paid by Automatic Payment, Credit card, Term by Term or the total for the year.

Student Safety

At the front gate on Clarence Street there are painted yellow lines which indicate that there should be no stopping or parking. These lines are there for reasons of safety. We also have a teacher on duty at the gate for safety reasons. While the majority of parents have proven to be responsible and have not picked up their children on these yellow lines there have been incidents when the teacher on duty has had to remind people about the existence of the yellow lines and the need for caution.

Clarence Street gets very busy at 3:05pm with children being picked up. This situation turns into a traffic jam on wet days, with the whole street getting blocked up. A very dangerous situation for hundreds of children exiting the school all at once.

There are alternatives to picking up your child at the front gate at 3:05pm. Firstly, we have a rear car park at the bottom of Sheehan Street where there is far less traffic. Your child could meet you there. Another idea is to avoid the 'Rush' altogether, which only ever lasts 10 minutes, and pick your child up 10 - 15 minutes later than usual.

The main car park on Clarence Street cannot be used for picking up or dropping off children.

Sports Trials

Term One at Ponsonby Intermediate is always a busy time. Lunch time sport, sports trials, and various other clubs and activities starting up for the year keep the students on their toes. In order for students to be aware of what is coming up and to ensure they are organised, they need to keep a close eye on the daily notices each morning. This is where all up and coming sports trials will be advertised. These daily notices can be accessed from any device by logging into your child's Ponsonby Google account.

Sports trials are already underway – Softball, Cricket and Tennis.

Other sports this term include Central Zone swimming and orienteering. If your child has a particular interest in these, tell them to keep an eye on the daily notices for more information.

Basketball

At our Ponsonby Expo on last Friday there was a lot of interest expressed for basketball, which is great to see. This year, basketball will not commence until Week 4 Term 3. The competition runs for 15 weeks at the North Shore Events Centre and the AUT North Shore Campus. Trials will commence towards the end of Term 2, so keep checking those daily notices. To tie the students over, we will be playing basketball as a lunchtime sport and will be practising and playing it in Physical Education. We will also be organising a Councillors 3 on 3 tournament during Term 2 if time and availability allows.

Netball

Even though the year has just commenced, netball season is fast approaching! By now, all students interested in playing for the school should have received a permission slip to take home, with important information regarding the trial dates.

All trials go from 3.20 until approximately 5pm. From here, the students need to keep an eye on the daily notices for notification of more trials and when and where the teams will be posted. More information will be distributed to both the students and to home once the teams have been finalised.

Education Outside The Classroom (E.O.T.C)

All Year 8 classes have now had their first trip for the Ponsonby ETOC experience.

The Year 7 students will be going on their first trip today. Our 5 trips for 2018 are: Auckland Museum, MOTAT, Circability, Uptown Bounce, and Parnell Baths. Each of these activites have a planned lesson incorporated into the programme by outside instructors and educators. Classes will also receive 3 sports lessons organised by Kelly Sport that focus on participation, movement and teamwork.

If you are available to help on any of these trips please contact your child's form teacher. All the information about EOTC and when the trips are, will be in your child's Student Planner.

ICAS - Exams

This year the following Australasian Schools' Competitions are available: Science, English, Writing, Digital Technologies, Spelling and Mathematics.

The Australasian Schools' Competitions provide an opportunity for all students to gain a measure of their own achievement in an external assessment situation. They can also be used to monitor individual progress in a range of subject-related skills and to recognise and reward achievement at all levels. If your child has strengths in any subject offered we encourage their participation.

Students who participate will each receive a Certificate and a detailed results letter indicating which questions they answered correctly, identifying the skill tested in each question and indicating the percentage of students across New Zealand who answered each question correctly. The results letter is also useful for highlighting student strengths and weaknesses. The documents are suitable for inclusion in a portfolio.

The entry fees are outlined below. The Spelling and Writing entry fees are higher due to them requiring hand marking.

We require the entry fee by **Thursday 15 March 2018.** We are unable to take late entries.

School Lateness - Important Information

If your child is going to be late to school, we require a note explaining the reason for their lateness. This note should be written in their student planner if possible. This system is very important for tracking students and is to ensure students are safe and arriving to school on time. If a student is late and does not have a note explaining their absence we will contact the parents or caregivers.

We would greatly appreciate your cooperation with reinforcing this safety system so we can ensure our students are not missing out on any opportunities that Ponsonby has to offer and that they are arriving at school safely.

NZEI Paid Union Meetings

From the NZEI desk...

We're all well aware of the nationwide crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers, and the heavy workloads putting massive pressure on all of us. A lack of resourcing for children with additional learning needs compounds the problems.

These issues are serious and growing, but together we can turn them around and ensure every child has a qualified teacher and receives the time and support they need to thrive at school.

Planning is underway for our major campaign, called 'It's Time' or 'Kua Tae Te Wā'. This campaign will focus on seeking significant investment into the education sector to address the above issues.

We will be holding paid union meetings in March so that primary members can talk about the campaign and what we will need to do to win. This will include considering our strategy for collective agreement negotiations this year and there will be separate meetings for principals and teachers.

The meetings are paid union meetings, which means the normal afternoon programmes (Periods 5 & 6) on **Tuesday 20 March between 1:25pm and 3:10pm** will not take place while staff attend the meeting. The school library will be staffed and remain open until 3:05pm. It is important for union members in our school to attend these meetings to have a say about the nationwide crisis.
