# Hurunui College

The Year 8-13 Swimming Sports were run yesterday in perfect conditions. It was a great opportunity for our students to get in the pool, participate and compete in a fun and enjoyable day. It was great to see those who took this opportunity and made it a successful day. However, it is of concern that we are seeing a downward trend in our levels of participation and capable swimmers. This is in line with a concerning national trend in decreasing swimming abilities. Swimming New Zealand statistics have recently show that 7 out of 10 kiwi kids could not swim to save their lives, with twothirds of under 16-year-olds unable to swim 100 meters and a quarter of 10-year-olds can not float. Drowning remains our third leading cause of unintentional death with 108 drowning in 2017, with 88 of these drownings being preventable. With 11,000 kilometres of coastlines, 425,000 kilometres of rivers and more than 3,500 sizeable lakes, we all live within easy access to a swimming destination. Ensuring that our children can safely enjoy these environments is a responsibility greater than what can be achieved at school. We have a great pool in Hawarden and a very active swim club. Doing bombs is not swimming and it is important that we look to balance developing competence with the fun side of being around water. We supervise and teach our children to drive, let's see if we can apply the same adage to water safety and teaching our children to swim.

Please put a circle around Wednesday 28th February. From 12.30 normal classes will finish and we will be hosting a school open day for families to be able to come into school and get a better understanding on what we do and what opportunities are available in the school. We will be running short workshops on topics such as "What is Solo Taxonomy", "Keeping your kids safe online", "Positive Behaviour for Learning/Restorative Practices", "Supporting your child with Reading and Mathematics at home", " The Parent Portal", "Area School Sport and Leadership Camp" as well as set times for families to connect with classroom, homeroom and SLG teachers. Workshops will be run at a range of different times so hopefully we can provide a time to suit everybody. The programme will be finalised for the beginning of next week and circulated to families. Buses will run early on that day, but arrangements will be in place if children need to remain at school to meet up

with families. This will be a great opportunity to ask all the questions that you don't get a chance to ask and to hear first hand about what we get up to at Hurunui College.

We are having an ongoing issue with managing the safety at the front of the school. One key area is around the hinging of the gate open. There is a real risk that we need to manage in the school and we do not want students to easily and quickly be able to exit the school. From the time students begin arriving at school and until all students have departed it is essential that the gate is closed behind you. Please do not attempt to tie it open. We have had a sign and other preventative measures removed from the gate and have now removed the latch that can be used to hold the gate open. Sadly yesterday I witnessed young students being collected from school and leaving unrestrained in vehicles. I will contact these parents directly but will not hesitate to also contact police if seen again. We all know better and as a community, we can not tolerate this.

Year 1-7 Swimming Sports are next Wednesday and I look forward to another great day at the school.

#### February is Oral Health & Hygiene Month

Reminder to Year 9 to 13 Parents that their children are entitled to free basic oral health services until their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. If you enrol with one of the selected practices you are entitled to: a FREE check up every 12 months and most treatments (such as fillings) are FREE of charge. The service does not cover orthodontic work and tooth whitening!

#### Standard treatments are free and include:

- Check-ups involve a routine examination, checking teeth for decay and looking at gums and mouth for any problems.
- X-rays are used to find tooth decay and other problems that can't be seen.
- Fluoride treatment helps make the surface of the teeth more resistant to decay.
- Fissure sealants are a thin layer of white filling, painted on to teeth that are at risk of developing tooth decay.
- Cleaning removes plaque, staining and tartar from teeth.
- Fillings are used to restore teeth that have been affected by tooth decay.
- Extractions to remove teeth that have been badly affected by tooth decay.

Year 9 students will have been automatically enrolled into either a nominated or local Dental Clinic. A list of Canterbury Dental providers can be found on the CDHB website under Community Dental Services. #### CONSULTATION ON PROPOSED DANGEROUS, INSANITARY AND AFFECTED BUILDING POLICY

#### BOIL WATER NOTICE LIFTED CHLORINATION TO CONTINUE

- Hurunui District Council wishes to advise it has now received three clear tests for the Hawarden - Waikari water scheme and that the boil water notice has been lifted. As soon as Ecoli was detected the council took the precautionary measure to dose the water supply with chlorine.
- In July 2017, the decision was made by the council to begin chlorination of five water supplies that were currently without chlorine or MIOX. In line with this, the scheduled chlorination of the Hawarden – Waikari Scheme was due to commence from early February. As a result of the Ecoli transgression last week, chlorination of the supply was started a week earlier than anticipated and the water supply will now continue to be chlorinated. This will provide a continual protectant that ensures any contaminants entering the pipelines are removed and do not put our communities at risk.

#### THE COUNCIL IS SEEKING FEEDBACK

- During the public meetings on the subject of continued chlorination across the district, it was put to the council that some members of the community would like to see an unchlorinated supply point that they could use for collecting drinking water. In order to provide this, a tap and filtration unit could be installed in the centre of Waikari.
- The installation costs would be in the region of \$2,000
- Annual maintenance would be in the region of \$1,000
- The council would like to hear from the community on whether they see this as a worthwhile idea and/or how many community members would use it. We are very keen to hear your feedback on this proposal. Please email or phone us with your views:
