

Kia ora koutou/hello everyone,

What a pleasure it was to be a part of the senior camp in Cromwell last week. A lovely group of students and wonderful parent support. The students were up for the challenges and managed themselves very well over the week. Camp is not only about trying new things and challenging yourself but an opportunity to bond as a team. The teachers learn a lot about their students during a camp and even I did during the two days that I was there. The Government is proposing to change the cohort entry policy so that children can start school with a group of children only after they have turned five. They wish to consult with the public prior to changing the law: Once a term at the start of the term; or twice a term at the start of the term and at the term mid-point. The consultation also seeks views on whether schools should be able to adopt either of these options, instead of only having one option in legislation. If you wish to share your views, you can find out more about the options and how to make a submission by going to education.govt.nz and looking under parents, cohort

consultation. Consultation closes on 19th March.

Thank you to those of you who took the time to complete the surveys that we had at the picnic tea and swimming club last week. The swimming pool has been very popular this summer with the excellent weather. Please always treat the pool with respect. It is not there to play with. Please leave it hanging in the appropriate place. Thank you to all of you who have given volunteer time to maintain the pool over the summer. We are looking forward to the Swim Safe programme that will start next week. Please send togs daily. This programme will change a little this year. It will be based on safety in the water more than the learning to swim. This is part of a National move to try to reduce the number of drownings in New Zealand each year.

When I was in Team Kakariki (Miss Van den Beld), on Monday, I was so pleased to see plenty of fruit and vegetables for the children to eat at Brain break during the morning. It is a long time until morning tea from when the children got on the bus in the morning, so something nutritious to snack on around 10am helps them to get through the morning. Children need good food for growth and development and to function well every day. Nutritious food helps them to concentrate and learn better. Sugary foods give short highs and then they feel tired or hungry again. Highly processed foods don't have nutritional value and make them sluggish. We only allow water and plain milk as drink options at school. Children are welcome to bring a water bottle to school to have in the classroom. The Public Health Nurse has a range of resources available to assist you with meeting your child's nutritional needs.
