Lockdown in Schools

With the recent event that took place at Stratford High School last Thursday; no doubt some of you may be questioning our procedures in the event of a similar situation. Despite this being an uncomfortable topic of discussion it is one that needs to be mentioned, so you can be informed about Eltham School's procedures and policies regarding the safety of your child/ren in an emergency event.

Like all schools, we do have emergency management response plans for a range of disasters/scenarios. Our teaching staff have been trained in administering these procedures and they know what to do and how to keep your child/ren safe. In a lockdown situation all staff and children would be locked inside a school building, not necessarily their own classroom. If necessary emergency services would be called. Lockdown does not always require the emergency services, such as in the case of an aggressive looking dog running across the school field, or a swarm of bees or wasps near to classrooms. There are a range of reasons we could 'lockdown' the school such as a gas leak, or a fallen power-line nearby.

We will be practicing the lockdown procedure here at school throughout this year, to ensure our children know what is expected in a real scenario. In the meantime we will be talking about 'lockdown' with our children, and we would appreciate your support with this. The main message we would like our children to understand is that at all times their safety is paramount, and the most important thing they can do is to stay calm, and follow the instructions of their teachers. We KNOW that when children are frightened the person they want most is Mum or Dad, but that eventuality is not always possible. In a lockdown situation parents/caregivers would <u>not</u> be able to enter any school buildings even if you did come down to the school, and we would prefer you didn't. Coming down to school is not going to help us in any way; in fact it means we also have to consider your safety, making the situation more difficult for us to manage.

We would contact parents to collect children <u>if necessary after</u> a lockdown scenario but during a lockdown you may not be contacted, because we would be busy dealing with the situation, working with those that can help us such as police, and focusing on the main task of keeping all children and staff safe. We would also be unlikely to answer the phone, as we would need to keep it free for emergency purposes. If you would like to see our emergency plans, or if you require further information about this and other response plans you are welcome to come and see me.


