- Waikari adjacent to the council's watermen's shed (Princes Street) 2pm-4pm.

If you are unable to attend, hazardous waste is accepted at the council's transfer stations during opening hours. Please note – household, garden, swimming pool and spa chemicals are accepted at Amberley transfer station only.

- The types of waste listed below will be accepted at the three drop-off points for FREE.
- Swimming pool and spa chemicals.
- Household and garden chemicals.
- Agricultural chemicals.
- Aerosol cans e.g. light gas and foam.
- Gas bottles and fire extinguishers.
- Fluorescent lighting tubes, compact fluorescent bulbs.
- Paint, stains and solvents.
- Car and electric fence batteries.
- Ammunition.
- Engine oil and unwanted fuel.
- For safety reasons, please remember to:
- 1) Ensure chemical containers are secure.
- 2) Where possible, label all chemicals.

PUBLIC NOTICE CONSULTATION ON DRAFT EASTER SUNDAY SHOP TRADING POLICY

The Shop Trading Hours Act 1990 (the Act) was amended in 2016 to enable councils to decide whether retailers in their districts can open on Easter Sunday. The Hurunui District Council must have a local Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy to enable shops to open. Previously the Act only allowed shops selling certain types of goods (for example dairies, service stations and garden centres) to open on Easter Sunday.

In accordance with the Act, the council is proposing an Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy to allow shops to trade on Easter Sunday across the entire district, and is seeking your views.
