Dear Bayview Families,

They say time flies when you are having fun and time is flying by at Bayview. What a wonderful start we have had to 2018 filled with lots of laughter and happiness. Thank you all for your flexibility around the building works and the restricted access around the school. We are as frustrated as you are around the delays. The Ministry of Education are overseeing this work so it is mainly out of our control, except when there may be a safety issue in which case I have and will stop work to ensure the safety of our students.

Thank you to the wonderful parents who have attended expectation meetings and spoken with staff to clarify things. As stated in an earlier newsletter you may not agree with every decision we make but I can honestly say that we put the children's needs first in every decision we make.

LEADERSHIP

At Bayview we aim to pass to each student as much autonomy and responsibility for leadership as possible, in order to prepare them for the world that they grow up in. It's not so much what they choose to do when we are with them but what they choose to do when we are not with them. Now is the time for them to learn to make good decisions and perhaps make a few mistakes so they can handle things later on in life. We are currently choosing leaders for our house system and our school council who will help lead school events and activities. All students will have the opportunity to act in leadership roles across all areas and levels of the school.

INDEPENDENCE

From the very first day at school we start developing each child's independence, starting with them hanging their own bag up and getting their book bag, water bottle and brain-food organised for the day. This helps them become responsible for themselves and long term helps them become focussed learners. As parents you can help with this by allowing your child to carry their own bag. We love seeing you walk your children into school but please allow them to be responsible for their own things. Allow them to get their book bag out and put it in the right place, allow them to get their brain-food and put it in the special container if this is what happens in your child's class. Then praise them for taking responsibility and for being independent! The positive messages you give your child will help shape their school experience and will help them grow into resilient and successful learners!

LONG BAY TRIP

On Friday 23rd February (tomorrow!) the entire school is travelling to Long Bay Reserve for a fun, team building day. This should have been paid by Monday so we could confirm numbers. If you do not have an ezlunch account we did send a special letter home with the last newsletter which you can fill in and send back with payment. We hope many of you can join us for this fun day. Please make sure you apply sunscreen to your child the morning of the trip and pack their hat! We will be checking the 'safe swim' website Please note there will be no one left at school to supervise any students not attending this trip. **ICE SKATING RINK**

We have been offered the wonderful opportunity of having a portable ice skating rink in our school hall! On Wednesday 28th February the rink will be set up and on Thursday 1st March and Friday 2nd March our students will have the opportunity to use the rink! There is a cost involved for the in school sessions at \$8 per student. This includes skate hire and lessons by an instructor.

The rink will be open for the general public to come and use on Friday evening from 3pm -6pm; and again on Saturday from 10am - 5pm. The cost for these sessions are: \$8 for kids, \$12 for adults and \$35 for a family.

We do need some help setting up the rink (Wednesday 28/2 at 3pm) and taking it down again (Saturday 3rd March at 5pm). We need 8-10 adults to help do this and it will take approx. 2 hours. If you can help with either of these times please let Shannon know in the office.

BAYVIEW SCHOOL UNIFORM

At Bayview we have a compulsory school uniform. Students must wear the school polo shirt with the dark blue collar with gold trim and the school logo, navy blue skort, shorts, or pants (not jeans), black sandals or shoes (black sports shoes are acceptable), school bucket hat (navy blue with gold trim), and in the winter our regulation school polar fleece. These regulation items can be purchased at the Warehouse in Glenfield Mall. We do have some second hand uniforms available in the school office, but once uniforms pass their use by date we throw these away.
