Emergency Preparedness

Last week's ex-cyclone warning was a good test of our Emergency Preparedness procedures. On the morning of the ex-cyclone's scheduled arrival we:

sent every family an email saying that we were staying open, but that families were welcome to collect their child/ren early. We updated the school's website front page with this information. We contacted every ASC child's family who was booked that day to ask for an emergency contact in the Newlands area who could collect children if parents were unable to get to ASC by 6 pm.

On the whole, this system worked well. However, we were surprised by the number of parents who did not check their emails or the website and who rang to find out if we were closing. We did not use the Emergency Alert on Twitter, as we were not closing the school. Some parents have said they would prefer to be contacted via text, so we are investigating apps which would enable us to use this method of communication. This of course relies on parents providing up to date and accurate information.

This is a timely reminder for all parents to ensure that all contact details are up to date and that you have organised for local carer (Newlands/Paparangi/Johnsonville), who can collect your child /ren if you are unable to do so due to an emergency such as flooding, earthquake etc.

Student Safety

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child to ask them what the password is - no knowledge of the password means don't go with the person!

Emergency Kits

Please send your child's named emergency kit to school as soon as possible. We suggest that you include items listed at the bottom of this page (check expiry dates!). Everything must fit into a 2 litre ice cream container or similar sized box. At the end of the year parents can request to have these returned, otherwise the school will donate these to a local charity.

Early Arrivals

Last year we met with a parent group to find a solution to children of working parents being at school between 8.00-8.30 am unsupervised. The arrangement is that these students may wait in the Hall, without adult supervision, provided that they are well behaved at all times. This system has worked well up until now. However, last week there were several days when over 22 students were in the Hall at this time, complicated by older siblings and friends from the Intermediate hanging around.

In order to continue offering this option, only those who actually need to be there should be in the Hall between 8.00-8.30 am! Please DO NOT allow your child/ren to be school before 8.30 am unless it is absolutely essential, otherwise we may need to find an alternative solution, such as opening a before-school programme and charging for this service.

Late Arrivals

There are a number of families whose children are regularly (very) late to school. This is unfair to both your child and his/her teacher. We ask that you please lead by example and demonstrate how important their education is by getting up in time to be dressed, breakfasted and at school before 9am every day. Please be aware, that schools are required to report continued unexcused absences to the Ministry, to be followed up by the Attendance and Truancy Service.
