Can you believe it . . . we are already in week five of an eleven week term that has Easter in the middle of it!

Swim Smart has started and will run over two weeks. It is very important that children have their togs every day during this time. We get charged for each child attending and it is important for all children to learn life safety skills in and around the water. There is quite a change to the programme this year, with the main focus on water safety and not teaching stroke. They do have to be able to swim for five minutes non-stop in the senior classes. To teach your child to swim, you need to enrol them in swimming lessons or send them along to Swim Club on Monday nights as Swim Safe isn't designed to do this.

Congratulations to the students who took part in the Southland Triathlon last Friday. Results can be seen further on in this newsletter.

Our Year four to Year eight classes will be visiting the Art Exhibition at Waikawa, on Thursday. I have been told that it is outstanding this year. We are so lucky to have such an outstanding resource as this in our Community.

From our survey of parents, one of the qualities that they consider important is resilience. Resilience is defined as, "the ability to recover readily from adversity". Resilience is when we make a mistake or don't get the result that we had hoped for; we can recover from this with dignity, learn from the experience and work hard to achieve better next time. Research shows that to support children with this we need to praise their effort, not tell them that they are brilliant or the best. If they are constantly told that they are brilliant at something, they give up when it gets hard and they have to work for results. The child that is given credit for effort will learn to put in the effort and achieve their dreams. Words can make or break you and can change your mindset. We want our children to have a Growth Mindset. Thank you to all of the caregivers that attended the Goal Setting Conferences. Our children have become more focused on their learning since goal setting collaboratively with them and your input is valued as the people that know them best. 


