School Mass:

The Term 1 school Mass will be held on Sunday 8 April at 9am. We encourage all families to be present as the children will be taking responsibility for the prayers and readings.

Religious Education programme at St Leo's School:

This is what your children are learning at present

Year 1:

Lesson Focus: Jesus – My Friend. Catholic belief is that Jesus of Nazareth, called Christ, is both human and divine. As a human being Jesus was born into a particular society and culture, and lived in a certain geographical location, at a precise time in history. To properly appreciate his message we need some understanding of these realities of Jesus' life. In learning of Jesus' friendship with his disciples we can come to appreciate his calling us into friendship with him today.

Year 2:

Lesson Focus: Jesus showed His love in different ways. Jesus showed his respect and love for the tapu of people in many different ways; talking, listening, sharing meals, touching, healing and, eventually, dying for them. We are called to follow Jesus' example. Our best resource for this is the stories of Jesus in the Bible.

Years 4:

Lesson Focus: Jesus came to show people how to live and lead them to God. Jesus invites people to grow closer to God – grow in holiness – tapu and mana by sharing in his life through the gift of God's grace. By accepting this invitation Christians share in Jesus' mission of worshipping God, and bringing about the Kingdom or Reign of God – Te Rangatiratanga, 'on earth as it is in heaven'.

Year 5:

Lesson focus: The Year 5 classes will be learning about the structure of the New Testament and how to locate references in it. They will also explore what life was like in the times Jesus Lived ad the other religious groups which were active and influential then. Children also look at Jesus as a human being who was fully human and is fully divine.

Year 6:

Lesson Focus: The fullness of God's Revelation Jesus Christ, the Son of God, revealed to the world that God is Abba – loving Father or Matua. In his mission on earth Jesus called on people to repent, through the grace of the Holy Spirit – Mana Atua, and to live lives of faith, hope and love. Jesus' whole life was a response of love – aroha for God and for people.

<u>Safety</u>

A reminder to all parents to remind their children in whatever way you see fit about stranger danger. There have been recent incidents of children being approached by strangers trying to lure them into vehicles.

Swimming programme: Postponed until later in the year

We have priced a swimming programme for the whole school at the Takapuna pool. However, given the extra costs parents have at this time of the year we have decided, on the advice of the school board, to postpone the programme until later in the year. The costs we were quoted were as follows:

- -9 x lessons at \$5.00 + GST per lesson per child.
- -1 x lesson on water safety at \$7.00 + GST.

All children will receive participation certificates for water safety and certificates for the goals they have achieved.

National Standards:

You may or may not be aware that the newly elected government has abolished National Standards. Their stance is that too much emphasis on National Standards has resulted in the narrowing of the curriculum and they want to encourage schools to broaden their emphasis on the whole curriculum, including reporting to parents across the learning areas.

For St. Leo's School this means we will continue to provide two written reports, one at the end of Term 2 and the other at the end of Term 4.

There will still be an emphasis on reporting in depth in Reading, Writing and Maths as the core skills needed for all students to access a rich and broad curriculum. However, we also report on other learning areas including: Science, Health and PE, Inquiry.

The reporting will be against the <u>curriculum standards</u> rather than national standards for each level. This is what schools used to do before National Standards were introduced.

Assessment

We are currently administering a range of assessments to gather data to inform responsive teaching and learning programmes. This will involve tests in Reading, Maths, and Writing. Diagnostic assessments in Spelling and Maths will also be completed throughout the term. I want to assure you that we work hard to know your child as both a 'learner and a person' as we believe this contributes to ensuring learning programmes are relevant and meaningful. Learning progressions will be used to track progress in Reading, Writing and Maths. These will be ongoing throughout the year.
