

It was great to be up at Windy Point with the Year 9s on their Orientation Camp yesterday. From what I saw the class was having a great time alongside the NCEA Level 2 and 3 Physical Education Leaders. The Year 9 camp goes back a great number of years and is provided to allow our new Year 9s to bond alongside their classmates. Over the last couple of years, we have adapted the programme to incorporate our NCEA PE classes who apply leadership skills and risk management assessment as part of the camp. This allows them to gain relevant NCEA credits through an authentic and worthwhile context. I hope the weather has held out for them over the remainder of the week and they return to school on Friday, tired and worn out from their three days away. I would like to acknowledge a big thank you to the parents who supported the camp, especially assisting with the providing of transport. It is essential that we have this support as it is a potential barrier to providing these types of opportunities. We work hard to keep the cost of these type of trips as low as possible and it is only through this type of help that we manage to do this.

It was great having Ken Terry the Police Education Officer at school on Monday talking to our bus prefects and students about bus safety. It is a good chance to give everybody a reminder about safe behaviour on and around buses. All students must remember that the bus driver cannot be distracted by misbehaviour on the buses and it is the responsibility of our bus prefects to help to manage behaviour. This includes ensuring that passengers remain seated and keep the volume to a minimal level. Also, please remind your children not to cross the road at their bus drop off until the bus has clearly cleared the area. A student running out from in front or behind a bus is the leading causes of near misses and accidents. For this reason, drivers please also remember that the legal speed to pass a stopped school bus, in both directions, is 20km/hour. Just because the car in front is going faster, it does not make it ok. Please also remember to be responsible when dropping students off and picking up students from the school. At the start and end of the school day, the speed limit in a school zone drops to 40km/hour. We often experience cars travelling down Allandale Road at excessive speeds and unless our behaviours change, it will only be a matter of time before this results in an accident.

We received news last week that one of our ex-students Anna has been awarded one of thirteen top Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) scholarships to students of Pacific descent from all across New Zealand. Anna is starting her two-year Master of Science degree specialising in genetics at the University of Otago. This is fantastic news and we wish Anna all the best.

Well done to all the students who represented the school at the Combined Country High School Athletics Sports yesterday. I am sure they will have represented the school with pride.

Lastly, a reminder to all parents and caregivers that with Easter falling within term time this year school remains closed from Easter Friday, through to and including the following Tuesday. This is for all schools.

PROPOSED EASTER SUNDAY SHOP TRADING POLICY CONSULTATION CLOSING SOON

The Shop Trading Hours Act 1990 (the Act) was amended in 2016 to enable councils to decide whether retailers in their districts can open on Easter Sunday. The Hurunui District Council must have a local Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy to enable shops to open. Previously the Act only allowed shops selling certain types of goods (for example dairies, service stations and garden centres) to open on Easter Sunday.

In accordance with the Act, the council is proposing an Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy to allow shops to trade on Easter Sunday across the whole Hurunui District, and is seeking your views.
