PAID UNION MEETINGS

BULLYING AND ADULT ROLE MODELS

Bullying isn't something new, but it has certainly changed over the years. One of the reasons you hear about it so much today is because it is happening in more places than ever before. In the past, children were often bullied at school or in their neighbourhood. Today, with the increased use of the Internet, children are now being bullied in all locations and at all times. This has created an epidemic that must be stopped. Sadly it is not just children who are being bullied on social media or even directly, but also many adults.

What Constitutes Bullying on Social Media?

Social media is one of the most used types of websites by pre-teens and teenagers. Connecting with other people can be a great thing, but it also brings many issues. Educating your child or yourself about which behaviours are considered to be cyber bullying advisable. Bullying through this platform can

- Posting negative comments on pictures.
- Posting abusive posts on a user's wall.
- Using pictures or videos to make fun of another user.
- Using social media to stalk.
 - Hacking an account or fraudulently making posts as though another wrote them.

Many of the acts of bullying on social media are similar to what they would be in a real-life situation, only in digital form. The impact of the problem is also similar.

Facebook and Social Media Bullying

A significant amount of social media bullying takes places on Facebook. This is due to many factors including its widespread popularity and its capacity to share photos and other media.

Even if you teach your children to restrict access to their profile to those they know and are close to, these social media bullying facts remain a shock. Even people who care about your children have the capability of hurting them through this social media outlet.

Just a reminder that there is a 13 year age limit for Facebook and Instagram. This is because younger students can struggle with identifying when they may be putting themselves in danger, usually by sharing personal details about themselves.

As adults we have an ethical responsibility to role model good behaviour on Facebook because let's face it there are young children with Facebook pages! We must also role model this in our everyday interactions because the children see everything and make judgements about how they should behave from these observations. If they see adults yelling at other adults instead of talking through issues calmly, that is how our children will in turn deal with situations; if they see physical violence being used to sort issues, then that is what they will do; if they see adults bullying on social media then they will do the same.

Just remember not everything you see on Facebook or other social media sites is a true reflection of what has happened. There are two sides to every story and often it is not until both sides have been revealed that the truth comes out. It is easy to react to something you see but be aware what you see may not be a true account of what actually happened. Please remember this when you decide to wade in on a discussion.

At Bayview School we take bullying very seriously and take immediate action as soon as it is brought to our attention. We make certain that with any allegations we thoroughly investigate it from both sides because as we know everyone has their own perception of things and it is not until both sides are listened to that we can ascertain what is actually happening. Often the children don't tell us what is happening
