Happening in Our School...

Rewa Rewa School Property Upgrade - WE NEED YOUR HELP NOW!

School Fees/Donations

Thank you to those who have already paid your school fees and donations – we really appreciate this, as the bills are already coming in (e.g. online student charges for using Hapara & Seesaw). Some of you may have read about the government subsidising these costs, however, the advice that we have received is that the earliest that this might happen could be 2019. Therefore, schools are being advised to invoice as usual, until advised otherwise.

Mathletics Payments

All students who have paid the \$10 fee are able to access this programme for the rest of the year. Payment will be accepted at any time during the year and logins given once this is received. Those children with no access will be able to use free online programmes at school. However, they do not offer the comprehensive programme that Mathletics is able to provide. Parents are encouraged to take an active role in looking at their child's site. Our thanks to the staff who are still fundraising to subsidise this programme by 50% to support our families.

Rewa Rewa School Curriculum – Building Active Learners

Our Teacher-Only Day workshop on 19 February with Bek Galloway was very timely. From this, the key areas that our teachers are developing in their classrooms are learning strategies. These encourage our students to be active learners by building a culture for learning. The first 4 steps of this work focus on talking, thinking, questioning and collaborating. We have also been following the work of Mark Treadwell, a leading NZ educationalist, who has developed The Global Curriculum (based on understanding the learning process and teaching concepts & ideas, rather than themes, such as "dinosaurs"). Some schools in Auckland are already 3 years into this curriculum and we are investigating their progress.

Helping Others

For a range of reasons, sometimes some families need a bit of a hand. If you can help with any of these requests please let us know:

- Spare raincoats that we could give to families for their child to keep
- Offers to collect students by car in wet weather, so that they can attend school
- English support group helpers some of our new parents struggle sometimes, to understand how schools in NZ operate. We need people who are fluent in languages such as Mandarin, Korean, Japanese and Tagalog, who can offer to be 'first contact' people who can be rung for help/offer help. If you are able to do this, we'd love to hear from you. We also wondered whether some of our families, where English is a 2nd language,

might like to meet up at school one evening to meet each other and share support – let us know if you would be interested in this.

Health Care

We have a number of students who have recently been affected by nits/kutu. Apart from sending home fliers about this when we know there is a problem, we need to have a more proactive approach from you, our parents, if we are to get on top of this.

As well as using special shampoo/spraying with lotions designed for this purpose, it is important that at least once per day, each head is thoroughly combed (using a nit comb), to get rid of eggs before they hatch. Other habits that may assist with your child keeping nit free include them wearing a swimming cap when in any swimming pool, not sharing hats and not touching head -head with other children.

I think it would be fair to say that every parent would really appreciate everyone making an effort with this ongoing issue. Thank you.

What to Do When Your Child is Sick or Away

If your child is unwell and not coming to school, please notify the Office before 9am **every day your child is away**. **Telephone** 04 939 0186, **email** office@rewarewa.school.nz or use the automated absence email on our **website**http://www.rewarewa.school.nz/report-an-absence.html

We must hear from a parent/caregiver, so please do not ask children to notify us or rely on classroom teachers to pass on a message.

Please be aware, if your child has vomiting or diarrhoea, they must be kept away from school for 48 hours following the last episode to avoid infecting others. They will not be able to swim in the school pool for 14 days following the last episode; this is public health policy.
