Waterwise

Auckland Council has recently changed the way in which it monitors conditions which lead to a green, orange or red grading for 'swimability' at local beaches. Our understanding is that the new system is sensitive to forecasts of rain rather than just actual rainfall. This has led to an increase in the number of orange and red alerts.

For each Waterwise session, our trained instructors visit Narrow Neck Beach and make an assessment of conditions based on information on the Auckland Council website; actual weather conditions including wind speed and direction; the level and direction of the tide and the state of the beach. Taking all of this information into account means that sometimes they may decide to go ahead with Waterwise even when a red or orange alert is shown on the council website.

If you are not happy for your child to participate in Waterwise on a particular day, please inform the school office BEFORE 8.45am.
