

Kia ora evervone

We have received our final report from the Education Review Office after their visit to our school at the end of last year. It is very rewarding to read the following: "The school has a strong inclusive culture. Teachers and leaders have an intentional focus on building positive learning relationships for all children. Students are well engaged in their learning and show an understanding of their role in the learning process." It is affirming to have an outside reviewer see the things in our school that we have been working to build. If you want to read the full ERO report you will find it by Googling Education Review Reports and search for our school. You will have heard that National Standards are no longer. I want to assure you that while National Standards are not reported anymore, teachers still assess the children to determine what their next steps are and to measure progress. Children will still be reported on their achievement and progress.

Thank you to the Home and School for providing funds to support extra Teacher Aides in our school in 2017 and again this year. This money allowed us to put extra Teacher Aide support into our classrooms, above what the Ministry funds and any learning support funding that we apply for. In 2017 Teacher Aide support was available for children in all classes based on the individual needs as assessed by the teachers. The money from Home and School was originally fundraised to provide a teacher to stay in front of a class when the school roll was expected to drop over six years ago. We have had unexpected enrolments and with large numbers moving out of the top end of the school over the last two years, the roll has only just started to drop now. Extra teacher aides have been able to support children with specific learning needs, help all children in the class that they are working in and provide more one on one support for children. We teach children at the level that they are at, not all children are taught set work simply because they are a in a certain class (this is what happened when I was at school). If a class has children at many different levels they can end up with an unreasonable number of reading groups, maths groups or many children may need a lot of help with writing. By having a Teacher Aide in the room, more children can get the help that they need from either the teacher or Teacher Aide. The hours are kept to the mornings, when the core subjects are being taught.

Today the older EnviroSchools children are off to Curio Bay for an EnviroSchools Hui with other schools from around the region. It looks like it's going to be wet but lots of fun activities are planned.
