Principal's Comments:

Dear Parents and Friends of the school

We are starting a new roll growth class at the beginning of next term and it is with delight that I can inform you that Jill Raines has won the position and will be back with us for the next three terms. This class will have 15 children, all starting on 30 April as we embark on our our second term of cohort entry.

Our school, like some other schools, is investigating play based learning and as a staff we have decided to implement a water play station which will be in the Junior Quad, and Mrs Sykes is leading this initiative. We are also going to redevelop the kitchen garden area, slightly. Mrs Harris and Mrs Perry are leading this initiative. Part of this plan is to remove the large garden bed in the middle, while retaining the 8 planter boxes close to the fence and the citrus trees, and turn the middle part into an area that will open every lunchtime for kids to explore, make mud pies, investigate bugs and worms and generally enjoy a small piece of nature while having

Therefore, this Tuesday at 9.00am we are going to have a working bee in the kitchen garden to remove weeds, remove old plants and spread mulch. This working bee will be led by Mrs Dunning. We would love it if three or four parents could give up 2 hours on Tuesday morning to help with this clean up. Bring gloves, spade and a drink bottle!

In 2016, a group of parents whose children finished their time at our school, wanted to donate a tree to our school, so in the future. the tree will be able to provide shade and children will be able to climb it. After much discussion, a established pohutakawa tree will be planted tomorrow. I would like to Keryn Christiansen thank for coordination and the 10 ex-parents for their generous gift.

It has been brought to my attention that many children are arriving at school early. We would appreciate it if children arrived after 8.30am please. I do understand the need for parents to get to work and our school is a safe environment. However the number is increasing and the teachers are being asked to look after kids in their room or outside their room. The teachers are trying to set up their programme for the day and have expressed concern about noise levels of happy children playing, or being in their rooms, and have also expressed concerns that a number of younger children are at school prior to 8.00am. As the seasons change, this early start will not be as practical as in summer. SKIDS provide before school care in the Rose Centre and I encourage you to look at this option if necessary.

With Easter just around the corner, it is timely to remind you that there is no school on Tuesday 3 April. Normally Easter is in the Term 1 holidays, so this is uncommon and parents may not realise that all schools are closed on Tuesday. Term 1 ends Friday 13 April and Term 2 starts Monday 30 April. During the holidays, Miss Hodgson and Miss Scurr are both getting married (not to each other). We wish both these wonderful people a lovely day and a future of happiness.

Our school participated in the Interschool Swimming Championships on Tuesday. Once again our children's behaviours were exemplary and our squad was very competitive. Our girls relay team came second, just, in a very competitive final and our boys' team came third and this race was also very competitive. Their certificates will be presented on Friday, at assembly.
