Matariki is the Māori name for the cluster of stars also known as the Pleiades. It rises in mid-winter and for Māori, it heralds the start of a new year. We have scheduled our next Whanau Hui for 9<sup>th</sup> May, early next term. We would love to see a bigger turnout to help us build towards this celebration. We will also be looking for donations of meat and veggies to help feed the masses.

With the Easter break coming up next weekend, it is a timely reminder that school will be closed from Easter Friday 30<sup>th</sup> March through to and including Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> April. As Easter normally falls during the April School Holidays we often are not aware of the extended break for schools. All school are closed on these dates.

Lastly, it was great to see the gift passed onto our Kakariki class from the Crusaders Rugby Team this week. The class were sent a brand new made to fit Crusaders jersey to replace the tired and worn out Canterbury Jersey that Ed the Ted has worn for many years. ### POTENTIAL PURCHASE OF HURUNUI WATER PROJECT SHARES

In 2017 the council decided to include the potential purchase of up to \$500,000 of HWP shares in the Annual Plan 2017-18. This provisional decision was subject to due diligence being carried out and additional public consultation being undertaken on the outcome. This was widely consulted on and resulted in over 100 submissions to the Annual Plan.



The due diligence step has been completed and no impediment was found to the council completing the purchase of the HWP shares on offer. At its meeting of 22 February 2018 the council resolved to complete the share purchase subject to suitable terms being reached with HWP on the purchase details and another round of consultation being undertaken.

The public are again being invited to have their say. Submission forms and further information are available on our website [www.hurunui.govt.nz](http://www.hurunui.govt.nz) and at our service centres and libraries.

Submissions close 5pm, 12 April

Submission hearings will take place on 17-18 April.

The Council will make its final decision at the conclusion of the hearings, if time permits, or at the council meeting of 26 April. Public Information Sessions will be held from 6.00pm at the following locations:

- Tuesday 27 March – Council Chambers, Amberley
- Tuesday 3 April – Waikari Community Hall

### HURUNUI DISTRICT COUNCIL – EASTER REFUSE AND RECYCLING ARRANGEMENTS

### FREE ASBESTOS INSPECTIONS FOR EARTHQUAKE DAMAGED HOUSEHOLDS

Asbestos is not accepted at Hurunui transfer stations. Only approved contractors are permitted to remove, transport and dispose of asbestos. Should work not be planned carefully and appropriate precautions taken, you may spread contamination, which can settle on carpets, drapes and soft furnishings and become airborne at a later date. It is imperative to avoid this risk. Funded via the Ministry for the Environment's Waste Minimisation

Fund, for earthquake-damaged properties, FREE asbestos inspections are still available for a limited time. If asbestos is identified, advice will be available regarding appointing an approved contractor and managing the process.
