Principal's Message

In the previous newsletter I shared with you some of the school's strategic targets and the achievement against these targets. The achievement is exceptional and a legitimate question may be, "how can this school continue to produce such excellent results?"

The simple answer is, Ponsonby Intermediate runs a specialist teaching model with high levels of pastoral care.
