You will have seen the many articles in the news media over recent times regarding the teacher shortage. It's a reality right now in Dannevirke schools. We have had vacancies advertised that just cannot be filled. This places increased pressure on teachers through higher class numbers and the subsequent work demands. This crisis will continue to grow because there are now 40% less teachers training from 6 years ago. Many of you will be aware that we have had a vacancy for most of this year.

We have considered all options so that we do the best for our students. Increased class size will not be considered.

The Board have appointed Leigh Buchanan beginning next week in Room 11. Leigh has been certified by the Education Council to teach because of her 18 years experience at South School and curriculum expertise. Leigh has great class management skills. Thank you to Room 11 whanau for the support in making this decision and we are confident of a great outcome for our students.

South School will continue to work at innovative ways of attracting teachers to Dannevirke.

From time to time we may need to combine classes when teachers are absent due to things such as illness. There are few relievers available and they are in high demand from schools.
