#### Easter Holiday Break

This week is a short week as we finish up on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> March (today) for the 5 day Easter holiday break. **School resumes again on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> April** for 3 days next week and a full week of school the following week. **We finish term one on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> April** and **term 2 begins on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> April**.

#### Anzac Day Service - 25th April

There will be an Anzac Day Service as always on the 25<sup>th</sup> April, which will take place at the Eltham School Memorial gates. It occurs during the school holidays but our children will be represented at this service and as with last year we will have displays of Anzac Day art.

#### **Athletics Event day**

On **Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> April** we will be holding our Athletics event, which will take place at **Taumata Park.** (Postponement day is Friday 13<sup>th</sup> March) The whole school will walk to the park (Rooms 1 and 2 will be driven there and back – but we need parents to help with this please!) and the rotation of events will begin at 11.30am. We will break at 12.30 for a half hour lunch, and then rotations will begin again until completion. We do expect Rooms 1 and 2 to complete their activities earlier than the rest of the school so they will be returned to school at approximately 2pm with Mrs Wilson and Mrs Haywood.
