



The school with the support of the student council is beginning a process around uniform review. This is a long time coming and will involve ensuring we answer a few key questions around our uniform. How do we ensure access and availability? How do we ensure value and affordability? And how do we ensure it is practical and flexible enough to meet the needs of the students now and in the years to come? The student council has voiced a desire to instate a school jacket similar to the one worn by our Area School Sports representatives at the Area School National tournament last year. Although a seemingly simple addition in reality this quickly becomes quite complex. If a school jacket was introduced to the uniform does it become compulsory and the only accepted jacket within the school? If not then why have it? Who wears it and would we expect it to be worn when leaving the school or representing the school at events or outside visits? It is not as simple as just adding another item to the uniform cupboard. I would be interested in having one or two parents voice (no more than this) within the review team to help in our discussions to provide an independent voice and parent input. After this any changes would need to be put out to the whole school community for consultation. Prior to even embarking on this process we have already found the blue blouse that is worn by the Year 7-10 girls as part of their winter uniform has become extremely difficult to source. This was once worn by Kaiapoi High School but as they have moved away from it, finding a reliable supplier has got harder and harder. To counter this and with practicality in mind we have decided that the Year 7-10 girls will be allowed to wear the same white blouses as the Year 11-13 girls. They will also be able to continue to wear the blue blouse. This is a good reason why the review is essential.

With the Easter break coming up next weekend, it is a timely reminder that school will be closed from Easter Friday the 30th of March through to and including Tuesday the 3rd of April. As Easter normally falls during the April School Holidays we often are not aware of the extended break for schools. All school are closed on these dates. Huge congratulations to Sam Weller for her most recent achievement, of becoming 2018 World Butcher Apprentice, at the World Butchers' Challenge in Ireland. Awesome effort! Sam travelled to Ireland, as part of the ANZCO Foods Young Butchers of New Zealand team, after being awarded Competenz Butcher Apprentice of the Year, last August.
