AOTEA LAGOON SCHOOL PICNIC TOMORROW

We are holding our annual picnic at the lagoon tomorrow. The postponement day is Monday 9th April.

Children wear their whanau colours (Kaka is red, Hoiho is yellow, Takahe is blue and Kereru is green), a sunhat, sunscreen, walking shoes and comfortable clothes and walk/bike to Aotea Lagoon for a picnic and a play. We ask that children do not bring any face paint to school or write on themselves with coloured pens.

Children in Years 6-8 who have returned their permission slips should bring their bikes and helmets to school by 9am for checking.

Children bring their own packed lunch and a water bottle. Ice-blocks will be provided at the lagoon.

Walkers will leave at approximately 11:45am and bikers at 12 noon. We would love adults to join us on the walk or on their bikes. Students will be buddied in older/younger pairs and will be clearly informed of safety issues by their classroom teachers. Family members are also welcome to join us at the Lagoon from 12.30pm onwards.

We will leave the Lagoon to return to school at 2.15pm.

Please collect your child <u>from school</u> after the event, as we want all children to travel with their whanau groups and be part of the whole school experience.

YEAR 1 AND 2 SWIMMING SPORTS

On Tuesday of next week, 10 April, Year 1 and 2 students will be participating in their swim sports at Tawa Pool. Pupils will be transported to and from the pool by coach. All children must have the following: Named goggles and togs

2 named towels

Brain food (Year 1 students will eat this at the pool)
Named water bottle

A plastic bag for wet togs

Year 1 pupils will be leaving from the dairy and their first race will start at around 9.45am. The races will be run in the following order: ping pong (9 races), rockets (6 races), egg and spoon (10 races) and freestyle (4 races).

The Year 2 students will travel to the pool at 10.30am and their races will begin at 11 am. The races will start with the swim races (backstroke, flutterboard and freestyle) followed by the fun races (noodle horse and egg & spoon).

Parents and whanau are very welcome to attend and support the children. Entry is free but please let the pool staff know that you are from Papakowhai School.

YEAR 3 & 4 AND YEAR 5-8 SWIM SPORTS

DRAFT ALCOHOL POLICY FOR CONSULTATION

KEY PRINCIPLE

Promoting a healthy and safe environment for students, families and staff in relation to alcohol.

THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL ACT 2012

The object of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol 2012 (the Act) is that:

- the sale, supply, and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly, and
- the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised.

"Harm" includes wider harm to the community. Among other things, the Act makes it an offence to supply alcohol to a minor (a person under 18) unless you are their parent or guardian or have the parent or guardian's express (written) consent, and the alcohol is supplied in a responsible manner.

USE OF ALCOHOL BY ADULTS OR STAFF WHEN RESPONSIBLE FOR STUDENT WELFARE

All staff and other adults must not consume or be affected by alcohol while responsible for Papakowhai School students on or off site.

PROVISION OF ALCOHOL TO STUDENTS

Staff members must not give alcohol to a student or enable a student to obtain alcohol.

USE OF ALCOHOL AT STAFF SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

Alcohol may be permitted at staff social functions at school or off site. If alcohol is available, non-alcoholic drinks, water and food must also be available. Adults are expected to drink sensibly and moderately. Students must not be present with the exception of staff members' own children. Alcohol must not be served to or by students.

USE AND SALE OF ALCOHOL AT SCHOOL EVENTS

Alcohol is not permitted at school events when students are present without permission of the BOT. Currently the only exception to this rule is the Year 8 leaver's dinner with families. Adults are permitted to drink alcohol purchased onsite at the dinner.

BYO alcohol is not permitted at school gatherings and events.

SALE OF ALCOHOL AT SCHOOL FOR FUNDRAISING

The school does not permit sale of take-home alcohol for fundraising.

ALCOHOL AS PRIZES AT FUNCTIONS OR IN RAFFLES

Alcohol may not be offered as prizes at functions or in raffles. (Prohibited under the Gambling Act 2003).

ALCOHOL SPONSORSHIP

School events, activities or resources must not be sponsored by alcohol producers or suppliers. It is not permissible to have teaching activities involving students that may promote the use of alcohol.

OTHER SCHOOL USERS

The sale or use of alcohol is not permitted when school premises are used by private parties.
