Dear Bayview Families,

Wow we are nearly at the end of term 1 already and what a busy term! The kids have been amazing really rising up to the many challenges they have been faced with this term. They have coped with two building sites and very restricted access around the school and have coped with reduced play areas! They have been incredibly resilient around all of this activity and change.

Resilience is not something that children are born with, they must be taught this early on so they have the skills to be able to cope with adversity or challenges. This starts as a toddler and then we can continue with your fabulous work once your children start school.

BUILDING WORK

The building works at the school are nearing an end (thank heavens!). Astley Construction are working hard to get our new classrooms ready for occupation from the start of term 2. but as we know with all things construction sometimes things do not go to plan!

Our aim is to have habitats 18, 19 and 20 ready for classes to move into at the start of the term. Before they can move in though we will have the classrooms blessed by a Kaumatua. We will let you know of the details around this once we have a clearer timeframe from the builders.

Over the April break the work next to the hall will also start (hopefully!). Our new court area will be laid with 2 netball courts and one basketball court and the general area will be tidied up ready for the children to use. The side wall of the hall will need a bit of remediation work as this has not been exposed to the weather before!

Once everything has been completed we will have amazing new spaces for the children to use!

We would like to thank you all for your continued support and patience during this very disruptive time.

RAFFLE

In 2017 we raised \$8000 from our school raffle. This year our target is \$12000. All money raised will go towards building a new adventure playground to replace the 40 year old original playground (which is really showing its age). FEEDBACK MEETINGS

Some of these meetings will be child led and others will involve the teacher and your child sharing progress and achievement information. These meetings are very valuable so you can find out if your child is tracking with the progress they need to make to reach the expected level with their learning. Once a child knows there is a great working relationship between home and school it helps them build their Bayview learner skills. We hold these meetings now as it is too late at the middle of the year to find out your child needs your support. If your child's teacher has not been able to get hold of you yet please phone them to arrange a time to meet.
